MARKET REVIEW

WEEK'S MARKET REVIEW

Notwithstanding the fact that the supply of cattle for the week has been only moderate, with the receipts pretty evenly distributed, the local market since the opening of the week last Monday has been on a gradual decline, and, with the close Saturday, values showed a general loss of 20c to 25c, while calves ended up with a straight loss of 50c.

Medium to good hogs have stood the pounding of values better than any other class of killing cattle, cows and thin butcher stuff showing the greatest decline. The Saturday market found good heavy steers of 1,100 pounds and better selling at \$3.75, good butcher cows at \$2.15, and the ordinary killing kinds at \$1.50@1.80.

Best veal calves are now selling at \$2.50 @2.75, while two weeks ago they were selling for \$3.62.25. The latter part of last week more than 75 per cent of the receipts of calves on the local market were forwarded out, leaving only a minimum supply for the local trade.

Hogs are in good demand here, but governed by the conditions in the north, the local market has been in a state of quagmire, the first few days of the week showing a gradual advance in values with a like decline during the last three days of the week's trading. Hogs sold Friday at \$5.50, which was in the same notch with last Monday's opening.

Outside competition has been good throughout the entire week, and with the exceptionally light receipts, this has had a tendency to hold values up. Fort Worth is now 10c to 20c above Kansas City and in direct line with Chicago and St. Louis.

A local commission house says on the sheep situation, "Very few sheep are at present coming to the local market. The demand is good for desirable muttons, from eighty pounds up, and we believe that shippers to this market will be satisfied with the results of their sales. Bulk of good wethers and ewes are selling at \$3.75@4."

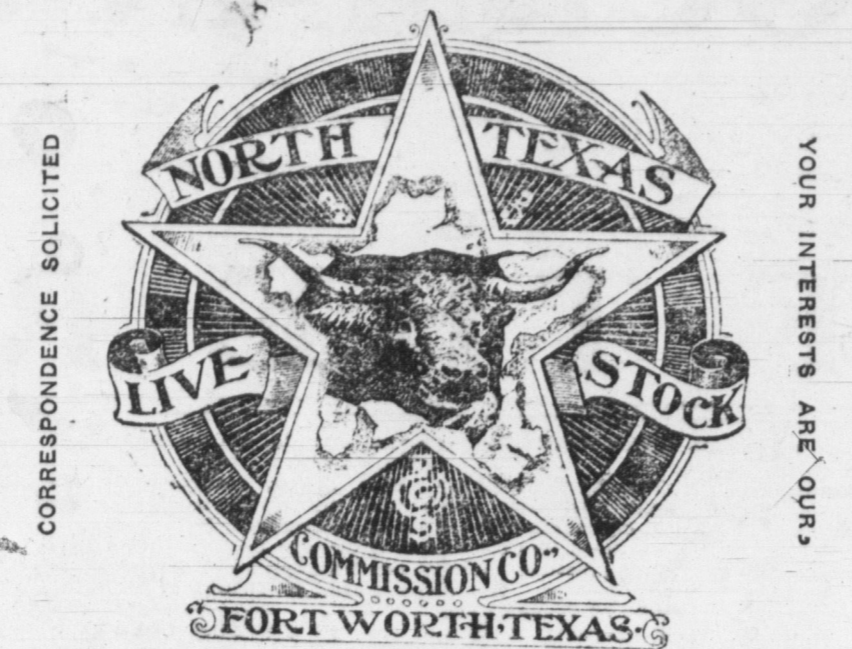

OUR WEEKLY MARKET REVIEW WE QUOTE THE MARKET AS IT IS.

Last week at Fort Worth, steers, cows and calves were lower than at any time since this market opened. Steers worth \$3.50 in St. Louis received a \$2.60 bid here. Cows that were selling in Kansas City and St. Louis at \$2.50 and \$2.60 sold here at \$1.90 to \$2.10.

The best fat fed steers are selling from \$3.75 to \$4.00; best fat grass steers, \$3.25 to \$3.50; good fat grass steers, \$2.75 to \$3.10; good 900 to 1000 lb. feeders, \$2.75 to \$3.00; two-year-old steers, good quality, \$2.25 to \$2.50; yearlings, \$1.65 to \$2.00; light heifers, \$1.50 to \$1.80; fat heavy heifers and cows, \$2.15 to \$2.35; ordinary good cows, \$1.85 to \$2.00; bulk, \$1.50 to \$2.00; choice light veals, \$3.25 to \$3.50; choice heavy veals, \$2.50 to \$2.75.

There are very few sheep coming at present and food fat muttons are wanted, at \$3.50 to \$3.75.

Top hogs are selling around \$5.50, with bulk at \$5.40 to \$5.45.

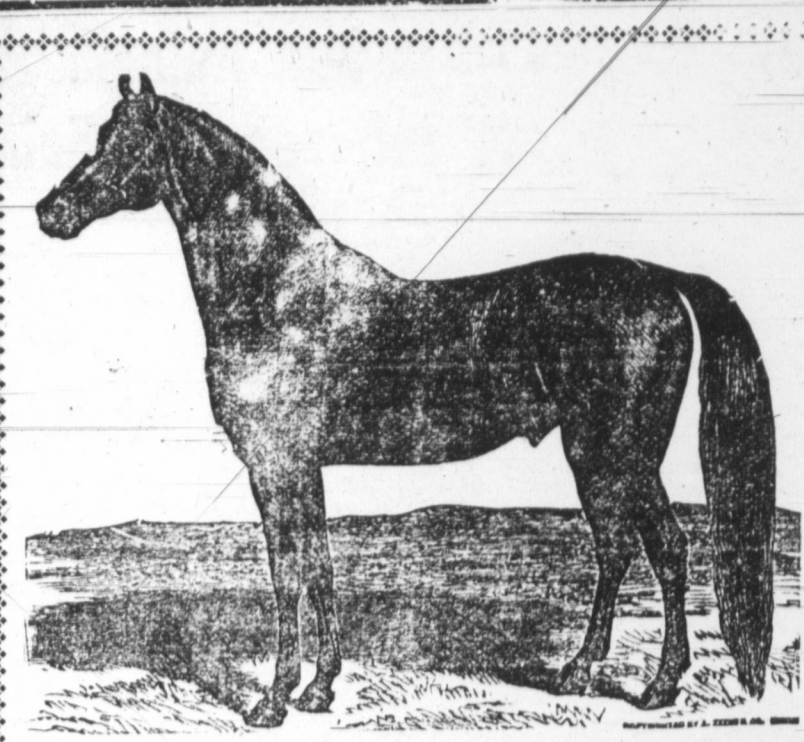
