New Ship-Warning System. In the ship-warning system of Mr. C. E. Kelway, signals by Hertzian waves are sent out from the lighthouses at regular intervals at the same times as the sound warnings. A vessel in range having a receiver notes the time that passes between receiving the wireless signal and the sound warning and is thus enabled to calculate its distance from the lighthouse, and, on repeating the observa-tion, after continuing a few miles, data is obtained for ascertaining the exact location of the ighthor trigonometry. 
