Water In Grinding.

Why is water used on a grind-stone in sharpening a knife? That is one of the questions asked on the porch of a summer hotel recently. and, although several well informed men and women were in the little gathering, the only one who could answer it satisfactorily was a fif-teen-year-old schoolboy. Here is the explanation he gave: The ob-ject in using water is to secure a stone, so that the entire edge of the blade may be smoothly sharpened. The application of water not only fills the little spaces between the particles of stone, but it softens them and thus makes a smoother surface. If a dry stone were used, the edge of the blade would be rough, for the friction would be unequal.

A Leading Question.

#### The Wickedest Age.

Merely as an illustration that the ickedest age of man is between and 30, the following is mentioned as proof: From April 1 to June 30 inclusive, of this year, 48,966 arrests were made by the police of New York, 35,844 of which were made in Manhattan and the Bronx. The greater majority of these arrests were men, the number being in the neighborhood of 30,000. Of the men arrested 4,500 were under 20 years of age, 10,282 were between 20 and 30 years old, 7,581 were between 30 and 40 years, 4,111 were between 40 and 50 years, and 9,032 were over 50 years.
