A Woman Inventor.

Flatirons, cook stoves and sewing machines have bowed to Master Electricity, but it remain for Mrs. Isabell Allen of Kansas City to devise an electric curling iron that would do its work succesfully.

This neat little instrument is made of nickeled steel and vulcanized rubber. At the end of the handle the circuit wire is connected to a revolving attachment which keeps the wire from curling up as the iron is operated. The circuit may be broken or completed by simply moving a s'iding button affixed to the handle. Unlike the ordinary curler, a side switch permits one prong to be moved out at an angle from the other, thus allowing the strand of hair to be wound about the rod without interference. This feature is especially desirable for crimping and saves times for the hair dresser.

The hair cur'er may be regula ed to three different voltages and becomes heated sufficiently for use within a half minute after connection is made with the ordinary incandescent circuit.

The cheif value of Mrs Aller invention rests in the even heat which it constantly maintains, that it will not sooroh the hair under any conditions and that it procludes all danger from fires. so many of which occur as a result of hair curling .- Record.


