This fact has been positively proven, and many inresults of records made of the been infected by these discharges It is!neither healthful nor oxhil arating to drink a clear solution of zewage from a privy, however diluted, but as a matter of fact it is astonishing how long communi-
tios may drink sowage laden water with comparative impunity, so lang as the sewage contains no typnoid discharges. This fact has prompted by development of typhoid fever, when the water would be discovered to contain the germ that could be traced to typhoid discharges that had recently been deposited in a cesspool which had
for years been polluting the waer unoticed.
Milk vessels should always be washed with pure water. In the
larges ci:ies weokly certificates from the family physicians of al dairymen are filed asserting that famiiles, or among their employees. This has been so effecduring the past five years not single case of typhoid has been traceable to inffected milk from dairymn.
The filthy fly is the main conta gion spreader in this oountry, particularly vhere vaultless pri-
vies are in vogue, and exerements are exposed to the millions of flies through the greater par of the year, the services of the
city seavenger boing called into use only once a month.
A fact regarding the typhoid germ not generally known and yet very important to be known that for months after the recovery of the patient there are millions of germs still in the system oapable of being tra
through the excrements.
The last method of the trans mission of the germ is by direct contact with the patient. This method is comparatively rare,
and comes from soiled hands that are not properly cleansed before something is handied and eaten The careless eating of the fruit that is left exposed to the flies in the sick room or a luncheon that has been left on the table or side been walked over by the filthy fly is a dangerous thing.
To distroy the ravages of the disease, every care should be exercised and the contagion mus
