Green Forage for Hogs
An especially timoly bulletin has just been issued from the Missouri Experiment Station by Dean H. J. Waterk, giving the otermine the value of different orage crops for hogs.
Thirty-six pigs weighing about fty pounds each were fed in lots on different forage crops in conncion with corn until they wer count boing kept of the cost of fgains made.
In cheapnoss of gains the feeds usod ranked as follows: and skim miik, cheapest; corn and alfalfa, eecond; corn and red clover, third; corn and bluegrass ourth; corn and rape, fiith, corn hipstuff, sixth.
A saving of about seventy-fiive ain was efferted by using green lover instead of fresh bluegrass. A saving of $\$ 1$ a hundred was f-bluegrass. This bulletin
