RAILROAD CONTRACT.

Articles of agreement made and entered into this the 16th; day of June. 1908, between the Southwestern Engineering and Construction Company, party of the first part, and M. G. Abernathy, M. V. Brownfield and William H. Shaw, as trustees, and M. G. Abernathy and M. V. Brownfield for themselves and for all others who become parties for all others who become parties hereto by subscribing to the agreement, parties of the second

The party of the first part agrees that it will construct and operate a standard guage railroad from the town of Hereford, Deaf Smith County, Texas, through the Castro, Lamb, Hockley, Terry and Dawson counties; thence in a southerly direction to a connection with the Texas & Pacific Railway in consideration of the payment to it of the bonus hereinafter mentioned and conveyance of a right of way 150 feet wide, running from the north line of Lamb county to the south line of Dawson county, along a line to be hereafter designated by W. A. Cullen, Vice-President and General Manager of the party of the first part, or a duly authorized agent of the party of the first part, provided that the party of the first part deems the amount thus secured satisfactory.
