The United States Senate will retain its present Republican majority. Gov. Charles E Hughes has bsen re-electod in
New York State by about 76.000 plurality.
Indiana has gone for Taft by from 15,000 to 18,000 plurality. Bryan apparently has carried Nebraska, although ans claim the state. Oho roturns have been seri ously delayed, owing to the immense size of the ballot, but Taf has carried the State by a maj ority ranging from 50,000 to $75,000$.
