Big Sale Of Wool

San Angelo, Texas, Nov. 10. Half a million pounds of wool was sold here tonight on sealed bids to two Boston firms and will be baled and shipped at once to Boston, going by rail to Galveston and thence to Boston by steamer G. W. Roote, representing Willet & Co. of Boston, bought the consignments of C. W. Hobbs and George Richardson, while James McGurik, representing Goodhue, Suttle & Emery, bought the stock of March Bros. There were seven wool buyers here and today they submitted sealed bids for the San Angelo stock, which consisted partly of spring clip and all of the fall clip. The Bids were opened tonight, with the result that the awards were made to the Boston firms. Both buyers and sellers refuse to make public the price paid, but it is known to be between 14 and 18 cents, and the sales indicate a strengthening of the wool market.
