Growth of the Panhandle
Texas is growing by leaps an bounds, and but fow realize the
handle of Texa has shown great er growth during the past few
years than mny other section of issued from the emmigration department of the Santa Fe rail-
road, in 1908 the Santc Fe railway carried into the Panhandle Texas and the Pecos valley of New Mexicn, 1648 carloads o immigrant outnts. A ear load of
such freight represent two faniiles,ocoasionally thres. Assuming. the average number of persons lots hauled by the Santa Fe means no less than 16,489 new population settled along that railway alone. Besides many families love gone in with less than carRoek Island and the Fort hauled into the Panhandle equal number of immigrants.
The shipment of grains to ontside markets is another indication of h's growth. There are no figures at hand of the quantities but the Santa other two railway but the Santa Fe report more than
2400 carloads. From Hiperins Sta tion were shipped 60 carluads 100 Pa 185, Canadian 145, Miam , Pampa 80, Panhandle 80, Can view branch 370 . Thess stations are all in Texas, From Amarillo Santa Fe hauled 175 cailway, th and if the other two railway hauled from there the same quanshippod from that station 525 car loads. Possibly there were shipped from Amarillo a greater num bor of carluads by the other two rying farm procucts eastwar hauled large quantittes of grain southeastward to Galveston, for export or cozalwise.
Hewever, oonsidering only the railroad, these shipments are a onvincing sign that the country is no longer in the experimental five in some localities, it still was a cattle country, but now it is farm land. Within five years the

Plainview section, out of-whioh the railroad hauled 370 carload of rain last year, contained the habitation only of ranchmen Now the herds have retired with-
in wire fences and the farmers are olaiming the land for homes By the settlement of this new population in the new country, Plainview has become a town of or more population, and is country. Amarills, five year go a town of 1200 or 2000 popu lation, now claims 12,000 . The other towns mentioned, villages only a few years ago, have grown equal proportion.
The movement of new population into the country this spring sumner and fall is expected to be reater than ever. Many men
who have never been in the coun try, excepting the judgmant of their neighbors who are moving will join the procession. So great has been this tide that many immigrants are pushing beyond the
