Miss Howe said that was a fair proposition and she accepted it. She went to work the next morning. She lasted just part of one day. She is no longer a suffragette. Here is what she says of the experience:

"My idea was to sail down about nine o'clock, gossip a little with the force, dash off an article or two on the typewriter, have lunch and go home. Instead I was routed out in the middle of the night when it was still dark and when all women are still fast asleep. I was hurried through breakfast and out in the cold to run for a car. The car was full of men; no women.

"I got to the office and was given a corner with some other reporters. I sat down and started a conversation, but they answered in monosyllables. In a few minutes each one grabbed his or her hat and dashed out. They came back at various times, rushed to their machines and began to write at a rate that got on my nerves. When they finished their mad race with the typewriter they rushed out again. I tried to write but the combined noise of a halfdozen typewriters almost drove we mad.



1, You shall sell your farm produce for cash wherever you can, but not to us; we do not buy from you.

3. You shall send in the money in advance to give us a chance to get the goods from the factory with your money; meanwhile you have to wait patiently a few weeks because that is our business method.

4. Send us your money and we will skin you on the quality of the goods.

5. You shall buy your church from us and forward the money ness method.

6. You shall collect from the business men in your vicinity as much money as you can for the benefit of your churches. Although we get more money from you than they do, still it is against our rules to donate money for building country churches.
