Killing frost has never occured arlier than September 10 south of the extreme southwestern ortion of South Dekota, extreme outhern Minnesota, central Wis onsin, and the interior portion lower Michigan. It has never cured earlier than Oct. 1 south the extreme north portions of klahoma and Arkansas, south orn Tennesee, and the mountain istricts of North Carolina and irginia. It has never occured arlier than Oct. 20 to the southard of the extreme northeastrn portion of Texas, northern ouisana, the central portions of Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia South Carolina, and eastern North Carolina.-Weekly News Letter.
