



Tread away, by the authority vested in me by the Commissioners Court of Terry County, do hereby declare a Limited Quarantine now in force, against all gatherings of any kind, such as schools and churches, moving picture shows and like gatherings, all crowding in and around stores, postoffices, unnecessary visiting, all are strictly forbidden.

On account of the Influenza, whch is now killing thousands over the State and Nations of the earth, it becomes mandatory that every precaution be taken to stop this dreaded disease.

Therefore, under the Penalty of the law of the State of Texas. you are commanded to use all dilligence to aid me in enforcing this ordinance.

As get we do not know all about Spanish Influenza, but we know two things, it is very contagious and fatal. It has killed six times more Americans than we have lost in the world war. Three hundred and fifty thousand have died in the U.S. up to Dec. 1st. It killed 300 doctors in two weeks. In nine cities, the mortality has been fifty percent of the Flu pneumonia cases, and 12,000 died in New York City
