CLAIMS SETTLED

When Mills county was formed out of parts of Lampasas, Hamiton, Brown and Comarche counties the three first named counties had outstanding indebtedness for public buildings and bridges. The territory taken from each county was held to be liable for its proportionate amount of the indebtedness and a special tax was levied upon the property in such territory. Lampasse and Hamilton counties were paid in full several years ago, but the Brown county claim being much larger than the others the claim of that county was not paid in full until the special tax of 1903 was collected. In fact, the Brown county officers made a miscalculation and claimed that this county still owed something near \$1000 to that county. Thursday of this week Judge L. E. Patterson and Commissioner M. C. Humphries went to Brownwood and assisted the court there in making the calculation of the amounts paid together with the interest and it was found that Brown county had been paid \$99.80 more than was due and the money was refunded by the commissioners court of that county.
