

This paper notes with deep reall cases are young children, and in a good many instances they are bitten on the foot or hand. In such cases the following remedy is said to be a splendid antidote for the rattler's bite, provided it is used immediately after being bitten:

Take a pan or a bowl and pour in enough kerosene oil to cover the wound. It will draw the poison out immediately and in the course of a few minutes turn perfectly green; then pour out the oil and refill the bowl, being careful to put in enough oil to completely cover the wound. Leave the fcot or hand in the oil as long as the cil turns green. Then put on a poultice of plain table silt and saturate the sait thoroughly with oil. Keep this up for about an hour and there is scarcely any danger of fatal results. Cut this out and preserve le. for future reference. -Ex.
