## AN EXPLANATION.

 Editor Eagle:For necessity is laid upon me 1 Oor. 9:16.
You know how distasteful it is for me to go into a secular paper with a religious trouble, but for me to remain silent now would be to do myeelf, my church and the cause of Christ great injustice. And that all may know that I am not aoting hastily or unadvisedly I give here the part of the report that makes this necessary.
"We find, etill furihar, that the Shaw Bend church continues as pastor a man who 19 preaching to a church that has been dropped from this association for disorderly conduct, thus continuing that church in the error for which it was dropped from our fellowship. We regret that deseolution was needed, knowing and feeling that some good brethren and sisters that we tove were thus out off from us, and hoped ere this they would have turbed from the error of their way snd returned to us. We are eapecially pained and are burdened because our brother that is preaching to them is one of our old and esteemed paators, but we hope that the Shaw Bend cnurch will urge their pastor to give up the old church at Mullin unless she repents

The report of which this is a part is signed by G. A. Jarrett and M. Stacy and was read and adopted by the Mills county assosiation at its last eession.

Now, Mr. Editor, I am not going to trespass upon your time and epace by writing about Shaw Bend church, for that church is able to attend to its own business and has done it and will continue to do it. Neither will I elaim space for an explanation of my own conduct, for I have been bere too long and am known by too many people and too well to make any auch thing necessarv, but I shall only state the facts about the Baptiat church at Mullin, for it is due them that these thinge be known.
