





It is what is wanted to make crops reasonably sure. This is a good year and irrigation is not needed. The fact is, however, that it is one of the best years for making tanks. The ground works easy. It is moist and backs well in the dam. The crops are good and there is plenty of feed for the teams while doing that kind of work. Another year may be a dry one. The ground will work very hard. There will be no feed for the teams and then no matter how much it may be wanted it cannot
