



An ordinance of the incorporated town of Goldthwaite, Mills county, Texas, decisring all fast driving, and ail racing, and all driv ing at a rate of have returned from Temple, speed faster than 8 miles per hour where she went to have their to be unlawful, and to be a nuisance, and to be punishable by a fine and providing for a punlahment thereof Be it ordained by the town council of the town of Goldhwaite as incor-porated, that hereaster it shall be, and is herenow declared to be, un

any vehicle at a rate of speed faster than 8 miles per hour; or to race with any other person on any of the streets or alleys of Goldthwaite or streets or alleve of Goldhwalte or other public place where either of the persons are on horseback or in any vehicles at any rate of speed whatever; and all such fast driving, and all racing whatever, are hereby declared to be unlawful and a nutsance. nuisance.

And any person violating the pro-visions of this ordinance or either of same, shall be deemed guilty of a

misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not less than ten nor more than one
