They can no longer make this statement. The only way your boys can get liquor now is through a saloon and if you want them to have it, vote for the saloon. The festive liquor drammer who formerly called on you for orders for liquor has departed The license he has to pay was too much for him and he is now engaged in other business. The legislature knocked him out. The legislature also paid its respects to the local tellow who took orders for liquor and placed upon his business a tax that destroyed it. The club house where liquor was kept in store for others has been taxed out of existance and you no doubt have missed them and I trust you will miss them evermore.






