ness of about \$90,000. This is the ay Governor Campbell and the hirtieth legislature found it. There was no alternation, something mus be done and following the previously made platform the governor an legislature set out to raise the neces sary funds to meet the obligation of the pas. I provide for the neces sary appr _riation for the following two years. This was done by the enactment of the gross receipt tax law amending the intangible asset tax law and the full rendition law, guarded by the automatic tax law, and what has been the result. Heretofore we have paid 20c on \$100 valuation each to the savalorem and school taxes and because of the gross receipt and intangible tax laws which brought into sight assets to the amount of \$178,000,000 which had not previously on the tax rolls been taxed, and this added to the gross receipt tax brought into the tressury more than a million dollars and saved the people who had heretofore been paying taxes of that ou m thereby reducing their rate from 20c on the \$100 to 12%c on the \$100 This was done without the full rendi-

tion amendment which will be in operation this year to aid in equalizing and thereby still further reduce the rate which will not likely be more than 7c on the \$100 for abvalorem purposes. Last year the school tax rate remained at 200 because the law provides that it shall so remain until \$4.00 for each child within the scholastic age is raised, there the automatic law steps in and says stop which it will in all probability do this year and thereby lower our state chool tax rate to about 15c instead 200 last year.

We should not complain at either the above toxes for the reason at we received in school money one direct from the state last year that we had paid out in both adem an school tax but about \$250.

The above facts make it plain that Mills county people have no complaint to make at Governor Camp bell, but on the contrary should praise him for trying to equalize the state's expenses and put the burden of taxation where it belongs. But who started this complaint and is probably supplying funds to carry on such an extraordinary campaign? Well, the gamblers were put out of business and they are sore about it. can at least feel like they have cause for complaint, but let no farmer especially of Mills county complain until you see the last one of the laws operate which they will do this fall. It does not matter who is elected go vernor, we shall see the result of the full rendition law and we can't p revent it. So let's not censure anybody until we see. If its operation proves a burden to the average taxpayer when tried, you will find Gov. Campbell and the thirty-first legislature ready to amend it to make taxation equal upon all as nearly as can be. No law operates perfectly at the beginning.

Do the farmers of Mills county want to make bedfellows of the various intrests above named, who are really not in sympathy with you, but want to influence you to join them against one of the best governors for the people Texas ever had.

It was not my purpose to say anything about Mr. R. R. Williams, but I will say, that if as the newspaper s ay, he is in his 70th year and has been unable to demonstrate more t han ordinary ability, it is too late to expect it now, and Texas to be properly governed needs more than the ability of an average man, and certainly not one in his dotage.

Mr. Williams has scarcely known away from his town except while in the 27th legislature and if you will examine the the records you will find that he voted more often against the interest of the common people, for the corporations and especially the railreads, than he did for them.

His own county did not appreciate his ability enough to accept his candidacy for a second term, but refused to elect him to the same office. Mills county did not do but little for Governor Campbell two years ago. I myself voted for another man, Judge Brooks, but I expect to cast one of the proudest votes of my life on July 25 if permitted to do so for Governor T. M. Campbell, believing it to be the best for Mills county and Texas people. As to our county Taxes, our assessed valuation last year was about \$4,650,000 and this year it is about \$5,750,000 or an increase of about 22 per cent. The expense of our county will not be l arger than last year and there is no reason why our rate will not be lowered from 40c to about 30c which will make the tax about the same this year as last. Legislative Record of R. R. ("Rail Road") Williams, Candidate for Governor.

(10) He voted against the bill to aid the storm-stricken city of Galve ston, known as the Grade Raising in the Legislat Bill. (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, pages 1078, 1079 and page 1124-1189.)

(11) He voted against the Double He ader Bill which was so bitterly and ought to be all fought and lobbied against by the his present deserved, Railroad Companies of Texas, and the enactment of which was a platform demand of the Democratic party. (House Journal, page 804.)

(12) He yoted against the Resolution of both houses requesting the Governor, that in calling a second Special Session, he would submit the platform demands which had not been enacted into laws. (House Journal, 1st. Called Session, page
