Ed Malett and Miss Iris Young were married at Hico, Texas, Wednesday morning at 11 o'clock, at the home of the bride. Mr. Malett is a son of T. H. Malett, who lives some miles south of Lampasas, and the bride is one of the nicest young ladies of the Hico section.

In addition to the damage reported from the storm Monday afternoon, the large columns in the new home of Judge and Mrs. M. M. White, some two miles north of Lampasas, were taken from their places and thrown prostrate upon the ground. The house was not otherwise injured.

The fire alarm was sounded Saturday night about 9:30, and the boys made a quick run to the H. & T. C. track, where the passenger cars and engine are stored for the night. By some means the waste oil on the track under the engine had caught fire and quite a blaze was ascending about the coach and tender, and the entire tank of oil in the tender was in danger of catching and exploding at any moment. The passenger coach was pushed by hand away from the fire, and the hose turned onto the blaze and in a very short while the danger was past. It was a close call and a dangerous place to work, and the firemen as well as the railroad men, showed a heroic bravery in their work of extinguishing the flames. —Leader.

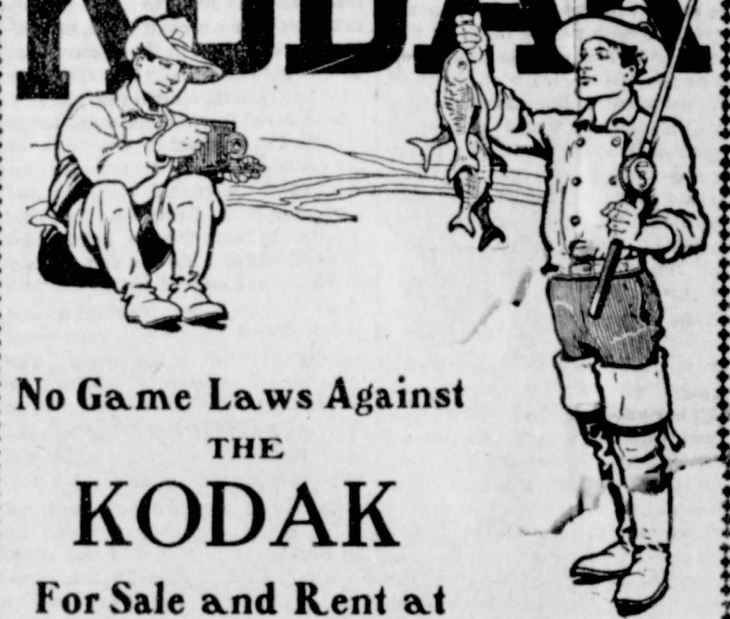

(Advertisement.) Legislative Record of R. R. ("Rail Road") Williams, Candidate for Governor.

Before a vote can be cast against the present Governor of Texas, who asks re-election under the immemorial Democratic rule allowing two terms to Democratic officials,--unless such vote is based upon no more than an ignorant and a hasty opposition,--it will surely be necessary to at least inquire into the record of his opponent, in the only public office of any importance that opponent has ever held. And, therefore, for the enlightenment of such members of the party in Mills county, who may have been deluded by the specious arguments of the "Interests" in Texas, which are opposing Governor Campbell, the following extracts from the Journal of the 27th. Legislature of Texas, are submitted. Mr. R. R. Williams was a member of that Legislature, and here it what he did: (1) He voted against the proposed law requiring Railroad companies to locate their roundhouses and general offices permanently at some place, and not to remove them from time to time. (House Journal, page 898.) (2) Before the above bill was finally voted on, he voted to excuse from its provisions the I & G, N. Ry. and the H. & T. O. Ry. (House Journal, pages 898, 897 and 898.) (3) He voted against the engrossment of the bill prohibiting the railroad companies of Texas from allowing Johnson grass and Russian thistle going to seed on their right-of-ways. This vote was the test of strength of those who opposed that measure. (House Journal,) page 682. (4) He voted against the appropriation to establish two experiment stations. The establishment of these stations was requested by petitions signed by more than 4000 members of the following associations: Farmers, Dairy men, Apiarists, Horticulturists, Fruit Grower, Swine Breeders, Live Stockmen, Nurserymen, Truck, Rice and Tobacco Growers, and kindred associations. (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, page 98.) (5) He voted to strike out all appropriations for the Live Stock Sanitary Commission. (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, page 96.) (6) He voted against all appropriations for the support of the University of Texas, at Austin!! (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, pages 95, 98.) (7) He voted to strike out the appropriation for the Girl's Dormitory at the University of Texas, at Austin!!! (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session pages 95, 96.) (8) He voted to strike out the appropriation to erect school buildings for the Southwest Texas Normal school at San Marcos. (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, pages 103.) (9) He voted to reduce the salaries of fifteen teachers at the State Deaf and Dumb Institute of Texas!!!! (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, page 103.) (10) He voted against the bill to aid the storm-stricken city of Galveston, known as the Grade Raising Bill. (House Journal, 2nd. Called Session, pages 1078, 1079 and pages 1124-1189.) (11) He voted against the Double-Header Bill which was so bitterly fought and lobbied against by the Railroad Companies of Texas, and the enactment of which was a platform demand of the Democratic party. (House Journal, page 804.) (12) He voted against the Resolution of both houses requesting the Governor, that in calling a second Special Session, he would submit the platform demands which had not been enacted into laws. (House Journal, 1st. Called Session, page 225.) (13) He voted in favor of the various mergers of the Railroads of Texas, and voted against that clause of the proposed merger law which provided that the facts of the legality of all such mergers should remain open to investigation and adjudication in the Courts of the State. It can be said without fear of contradiction, that not one of these votes will meet the approval of a single intelligent Democratic voter in Mills County. And it can also be said from this record: (1) That he is ignorant, and opposed to education; (2) That he is not in sympathy with the farmers, stockmen and school teachers.

### TERRELL ADCOCK KILLED.

Two Young Men in Jail Charged With Having Committed the Deed.

Terrell J. Adcock was killed while at work in his field a few miles north of Center City Wednesday afternoon about 6 o'clock. He was shot in the left shoulder, twice in the left side, once in the right hip and in the back of the head, Led Green, son of Henry Green, whose home is within a short distance of the scene of the killing, surrendered to the sheriff Wednesday and was placed in jail charged with the murder of Mr. Adcock. Thursday there were other developments in the case to the filing of a charge against Ed Green, brother of Led, with Sheriff Ezzell left here Wednesday afternoon for the home of the young man's father to make the arrest. Upon reaching the place he found that the man had left and he started in pursuit. Early yesterday morning he came upon Ed Green in a pasture near Pottsville and arrested him and brought him to Goldthwaite and placed him in jail.

As far as known to the officers now there were no eye witnesses to the killing except Mr. Adcock's little son, who was in the field with his father, and the child is too small to know much about it. Adcock was in the home a short distance from the field and heard a shot and then his husband called for some one to bring him a gun, but when he reached him he was dead and his clothing was on fire, the shots having been fired at such close proximity to his body as to ignite his clothing.

No examining trial has yet been held and the Eagle is unable to say how strong the evidence is against the parties arrested, neither do we know the cause for the killing. It is claimed that there had been hard feeling between the parties for some time.

### Political Speaking.

Judge T. S. Henderson, one of the leading lawyers of the Cameron bar, spoke here Monday night in the court house in the interest of Governor Campbell. There was only a small audience, but the crowd would have been larger had the lights been turned on earlier in the court house. There was something wrong with the lights in the building and it was after 9 o'clock before the speaking commenced. Mr. Henderson was introduced by Mr. Leonard Doughty of this city, who made a short introductory talk in favor of Mr. Campbell's nomination.

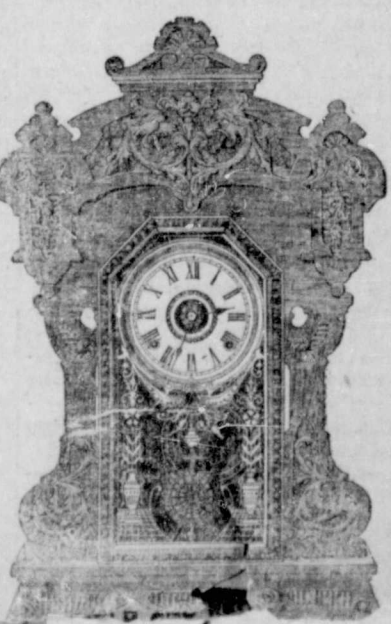

SUBMISSION IS THE ONLY ISSUE. Below is shown the questions of submission and local option as they will appear on the official ballot in the primary July 25th. If you wish to vote against the liquor traffic, scratch your ticket as shown on this sample ballot: All but the first SCRATCH EVERYTHING EXCEPT "FOR THE SUBMISSION."

Here is the way the two questions will appear on the official ballot:

"For the submission by the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Texas of a constitutional amendment to the people of the State of Texas for their adoption or rejection, prohibiting within the State of Texas the manufacture, sale, gift, exchange and intra-state shipment of spirituous, vinous and malt liquors and medicated bitters, capable of producing intoxication, except for medicinal and sacramental purposes."

"Against the submission by the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Texas of a constitutional amendment to the people of the State of Texas for their adoption or rejection, prohibiting within the State of Texas the manufacture, sale, gift, exchange and intra-state shipment of spirituous, vinous and malt liquors and medicated bitters, capable of producing intoxication, except for medicinal and sacramental purposes."

"For the system of local option, and appropriate enactment for the perfection of our laws so as to prevent the barter, sale or exchange of intoxicating beverages or liquors, in local option districts."

"Against the system of local option, and appropriate enactment for the perfection of our laws so as to prevent the barter, sale or exchange of intoxicating beverages or liquors, in local option districts."

The question of local option was placed upon the ticket by the liquor interests to confuse the people in voting upon this question, therefore a vote for local option in this election is voting to continue saloons in Texas; so we advise all who are opposed to these drunkard factories remaining in Texas to vote as above indicated.

Our Campaign Committee convened in Dallas on the 15th of June, and issued the following statement: "Whereas, Local option is already imbedded in the Constitution of the State of Texas, and it is incumbent upon the Legislature to perfect our laws so as to make our Constitution effective, therefore,

"We advise our people who are opposed to the saloon to vote for the submission of a Constitutional amendment providing for State-wide prohibition without reference to the local option question.

"The system of local option is thoroughly established in our State. The Legislature is by the very nature of things bound to make the law as effective as possible, and every man who opposes the liquor traffic is committed to this principle. The men who stand for the submission of State-wide prohibition are the men who have fought for and defended our local option system at all times and under every circumstance. If this system were called in question or in any way endangered, except of being supplanted by a system that we believe to be broader and better, they would be the first men to rally to its support and defense.

"The local option system is not in any way an issue before the people of Texas. The system is not called in question. The proposition put on the ticket suggests no specific legislation for the strengthening of the law. It is simply a subterfuge for the purpose of confusing the minds of voters and of dividing, if possible, the prohibition vote. The Legislature is under obligation to do all the alleged local optionists ask for without any instruction, and the friends of State-wide prohibition will be there to help.

"If our enemies, who call themselves local optionists, but who are really opposed to prohibition in any kind of form, had put on the ticket a demand for some specific legislation for the strengthening of local option, such as making the violation of the local option law a felony and making it a felony to rent property for that purpose, they would find our committee helping them in every way possible and voting for it to a man.

"But as their proposition calls for nothing that we have not as a Constitutional right, and binds nothing on the Legislature that is not already bound on that body, and is nothing but an effort to confuse the voters of Texas, we pass it by and take our stand for the submission of State-wide prohibition.

"In this we are only asking that the people of Texas be permitted to pass on the question of a Constitutional amendment and settle it for themselves, without in any way committing the Democratic party on the question of prohibition."

This will no doubt make the scheme of the liquor people perfectly plain, and I do hope you will assist in getting the matter before the people of your precinct.
