

NEW BRITISH NAVAL MONSTER

The Neptune the Largest of Moder Vessels of Dreadnought Type of Construction.

The Neptune is the eighth British Dreadnought battleship built for admiralty. She is 530 fee long, 84 feet beam, with displace ment of 20,250 tons (a thousand tons heavier and 30 feet longer than the St. Vincent, the battleship of the same type launched from the Her same slip about a year ago). engines, which are to be on the turbine principle, will be of 25,000 in dicated horsepower, which will give a speed of 26 knots. The Neptune is to be armed with ten 12-incl guns, like the previous Dread noughts, but they will be differentl disposed. The fore barbette will b in the same position on the forecas tle, but the side barbettes will be er eschelon, one being a little more for ward than that on the other side while the superstructure will be s constructed as to enable guns to fir on either side. The broadside fir will therefore be ten guns to th Dreadnought's eight. The other tw barbettes will be on the center line astern, but one will be on a highe level than the other so as to enabl its guns to fire over the other; fou seven-inch guns are to be placed in the superstructure as the anti-tor pedo armament. The armor pro tection will be similar to that o previous ships of the class, and will all the internal arrangements and the new ship will also have four propellers and twin rudders.
