The decision of the higher court is by Judge Jenkins, who holds that the council had a right to change the form of government withou: submitting the question to a vo e of the citizens. Judge Jenkins says that it might be a better way to submit the question of changing the form of city government to a vote of the people, but the legislature did not provide for the change to be made in that way and the city incorporation is therefore legal.
