Straight Talk.

Col. G. I. Goodwin of Brownwood gives some good straight talk to men who claim that they are Democrate and yet are not bound by the July primary. Hie letter appeared in the Dailas News a few days ago and is as follows: FROM A CONFEDERATE VETERAN.

I see in the Newsof last Saturday a warning to Confederate coldiers by P. F. Paige, chairman of the State Prohibition Committee. The Confaderates are Democrate, many of them prohibition Democrats, and as such they went into the July primary election and pledged themselves to vote for the nominees of the Democratic party. 
