

The postmaster general says there need be no serious apprehension as to the effects of the new law. He says that holders of lock boxes at first and second class postoffices will have access to them as usual, although no mail deliveries will be made on the street or at postoffice windows. Mail for hotel guests and newspapers will be delivered through their lock boxes by a simple arrangement of having more mail sorted on the railway mail cars before it reaches its destination. Such mail will be distributed immediately upon its arrival at the office of destination.
