





The election today is not to determine whether or not we will have a, court house, but rather to detera court house, but rather to deter-mine whether the house will be built with money secured by the sale of bonds payable in from 10 to 40 years or will be built with county warrants payable whenever the money is in the treasury. The bonds will require an additional tax levy of 2 cents on the \$100 valuation over the present levy, or 7 cents on \$100 in the entirety, while the court has the authority to make a special levy to pay the warrants and that levy can be as much as 50 cents on \$100 valuation, if the court so desires. Notwithstanding the fact that the special levy will undoubtedly be much greater than the amount required by the bond system, the war-For Commissionerand Justice of the rants can not be placed at face value and by that method we will get a house of perhaps one-third less value for the same amount.

COURT HOUSE BONDS.

The commissioners court is forced by law to provide or build a court house and as there are no court houses for rent in the county it will be necessary to build one. 
