

LIQUOR SHIPMENT LAW.

Because of the fact that many people do not understand the new liquor law, the Anti-Saloon League has given some important data concerning i's operations. Following are worth remembering:

"It is unlawful for any person, firm or incorporation to deliver intoxcating liquor for any transportation to any point in dry territory in the state

"It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to transport or deliver to any person, firm or corporation, liquor in dry territory in the
