The ruling of the state Democrttic executive committee that local candidates shall be assessed to pay the expense of a second senatorial prinary election is manifestly unjust. for the candidates for local offic s can have no more interest in the senatorial election than other Democrats have in it. Just why the committee should have decided to order this assessment in pr ference to soliciting public contributions or some other plan is not clear, but the order was made and the county executive committee viry properly levied the assissment, with the undertanding that the amount paid by candidates for the scond senatorial primary should be held in trust and returned to the candidat s in case

the supreme court holds that such a sessment is without authority of law. To n fuse to make any provision whatever for holding the primary would have the effect of preventing citizens in the county from sharing in the selection of one of the two candidates for senator who will be in the second primary. A request has been made by the county execu. tive committee that the second primary be held free of charge and if this is done the amount assessed can be returned to the candidates for county and precinct offices, even though the supreme court holds such ssessment can legally be required ty the state committee.


