#### TO THE DEMOCRATS OF THE 94th LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT OF TEXAS, COMPOSED OF HAMILTON AND MILLS COUNTIES

ME. A.

Having heretofore formally announced my candidacy for Representative from this district, subject to the action of the Democratic primaries, I desire to state my views on those questions of public interest affecting the welfare of Texas. In the outset, I might well say that "Fewer Laws and Better Laws" ought to be the slogan of Texas democrats. A purpose to advance any special interest at the expense of other interests by legislation ought forever to be barred from the minds of our people as well as our representatives. In the year 1915 it cost more than sixteen and one-half million dollars to run the government of Texas and support her institutions; hence it will be readily observed that our State government has become a gigantic business affair, with our taxes increasing rapidly and the representatives of the people appropriating a large part of this enormous sum of money; hence every voter should be interested in the election of not only honest, but able representatives, as the chief business of a representative of Texas is faithfully to represent the taxpayers while doing justice to our institutions. This is my ambition and purpose, and I consider it a worthy ambition, although it is freighted with great responsibility. I submit for your consideration the following issues likely to come before the next session of the

I. The Robertson Insurance Law, which became effective in 1907, was enacted because it had come to light that several millions of dollars were being collected from policy-holders in Texas and very little of that money invested in Texas securities. Hence the law provided that 75 per cent of the reserve of Texas policies should be invested in certain approved Texas securities; first, to safeguard the policy-holder, and second, to aid in the development of our State by the investment of large sums of money. The policy-holders have, therefore, been protected, and the increase in investment in Texas securities by insurance companies in seven years time has been nearly forty million dollars; therefore, no law on our statute books ever had a better purpose or came more nearly doing what was intended by the framers of the law. I am, therefore, heartily in favor of the law and the retention of the compulsory investment clause thereof, and shall vote for same in the primary in July, and it is my earnest hope that a great majority of the people of Texas will do likewise, that the next Legislature may be instructed to maintain the law.

II. The Warehouse and Marketing Law provides, in Section Five thereof, that samples of cotton amounting to one pound shall be taken by the ginner from each bale, and it having been proven that such samples are not acceptable in trade, it is my belief that this section of the law should be repealed for the reason that it is exceedingly expensive and has failed to meet its purpose. The main purpose of the law is good, as it seeks to make possible the holding of cotton without deterioration, that same might be used as collateral security, to the end that the crop might not be forced on the market without a profit to the producer, and in this respect the law has my hearty approval.

III. I favor ample appropriations for Educational and Eleemosynary institutions, and that the State should specially provide sufficient means to remove the unfortunate insane of the State now confined in county jails. Our Rural Schools should be of the best and I shall favor any legislation looking to their betterment.

IV. I favor the enactment of more stringent and effective laws against usury, as those least able to pay are usually the victims when the law is violated.

V. I believe our system of levying taxes is wrong, and favor the enactment of a law providing for the assessment of only such equity as the owner of the property has. For instance, a man owns a farm worth \$6,000.00, on which he owes \$3,000.00. In this case he should only pay taxes on \$3,000.00, for that, in fact, is all the equity he has in the property, and the holder of the debt should pay taxes on the amount of same. This system would cover all property, and the man who was struggling to pay for a home, paying interest on a large debt, would not be taxed on property values

VI. I favor authorizing the organization of land loan banks or associations to aid the farmers of Texas in acquiring homes and additional lands by lending money on long time at low rate of interest, to the end that tenantry may be reduced. Haying been engaged for many years in the business of securing loans for farmers to take up and extend their debts, I am convinced that Texas can perform no more worthy act than to provide a system that will be conducive to home ownership.

VII. I favor economy in all departments of government, in order that taxes may be reduced to the minimum.

VIII. I have always believed that the State should have no greater rights for the collection of taxes than the individual has for the collection of that limitation should always have run against taxes the same as against a promissory note. But the last legislature passed a law, shown on page 250 of the Acts of the Last Legislature, which provides for the collection of taxes as they come due, and making a heavy penalty upon the collector and the county attorney if they fail to perform their duty under the law, and providing further for removal from office for such failure, and that the Commissioners Court shall refuse to accept settlements from the officers unless this law has been complied with, and it is my bellef that this law is strong enough to force the collection of taxes within one year after they become due.

I respectfully solicit your support in the coming primary election, to be held July 22nd, promising, if nominated and elected, I shall give you the best service of Respectfully, which I am capable.







Proposing an amendment to Section 3 Article 7, of the Constitution of the State of Texas, cuthorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem county tax not to exceed fifty conts on the one hundred dollars valua. tion of property for the mainten. and of the public schools of the county, and authorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem district tax not to exceed one dollar on the one hundred dollars valuation of property for the maintenance of the public schools of

B: it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:


Section 1. That Section 3 of rticle 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to her .. after read as follows:

Section 3 School Taxes-One. fourth of the revenue derived from the State occupation tax's, and a pell tax of \$1.00 on every male inhabitant of this State between the ages of 21 and 60 years shall be set tion thereto there shall be levied and collected an annual ad valor m State tax of such an amount, not to exceed 20 cepits on the \$100.00 valu. ation, as with the available school fund arising from all other sources will be sufficient to maintain and support the public frie schools of this State for a period of not less than gix months in each year. The L gislature may authorize the levy and collection of an annual ad valorem county tax within the counties of this State not to exceed 50 cents on the \$100.00 valuation of property situated within the county; provided, a majority of the qualified property sapaying voters of the county votirg at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, for the urpose of maintaining the public free schools of the county, and the Legislature may also provide for the formation of school districts by gen. eral or special law, without the local notice required in other cases of special legislation, and all such school districts, whether created by general or special law, may embrace parts of two or more counties, and the Legislature shall be authorized to pass laws for the assessment and collection of taxes in all said districts and for the management and control of the public school or schools of such district, whether such districts are composed of t rritory wholly with in a county or in parts of two or more counties. 
