FINDING PROFITABLE CROPS

The fact that diversification of rops this year is practiced to a considerable extent gives us a chance to find the crops that are profitable and those that do not pay ordinarily Does a man come to the knowledge to produce them. It is quite true that no definite conclusions should be crawn from one year's results. Market prices and seasons that control the yield must be duly considered. But while several crops are growing the same season and no quite similar soil is a good time to collect data.

> Every crop should be grown on probation that it pay a profit above the expense of production. The fact that it is a staple crop in the community and staple markets are established of course mu t not be overcrop should be grown timply for the sake of diversification or a variety. POSES H. J. R. No. 30) House Joint Resolu-

Proposing an amendment to Section 3 Article 7, of the Constitution of of the district.' the State of Texas, authorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem county tax not to exceed fifty cints on the one hundred dollars valuation of property for the mainten. ance of the public schools of the county, and authorizing the levy and collection of an ad valorem district tax not to exceed one dollar on the one hundred dollars valuation of property for the maintenance of the public schools of the district.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Artticle 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to hereafter read as follows:

Section 3 School Taxes-Onefourth of the revenue derived from the State occupation taxes, and a pell tax of \$1.00 on every male inbabitant of this State between the ages of 21 and 60 years shall be set apart annually for the benefit of the public free schools, and in addition thereto there shall be levied and collected on annual ad valoram State tax of such an amount, not to exceed 20 cents on the \$100.00 valuation, as with the available school fund arising from all other sources will be sufficient to maintain and support the public free schools of this State for a period of not less than six months in each year. The L-gislature may authorize the levy and collection of an annual ad valorem county tax within the counties of this State not to exceed 50 c nts on the \$100.00 valuation of property situated within the county; provided, a majority of the qualified property axpaying voters of the county votirg at an election to be held for that purpose shall vote such tax, for the purpose of maintaining the public free schools of the county, and the Legislature may also provide for the fermation of school districts by gen. cial or special law, without the local notice required in other cases of special legislation, and all such school districts, whether created by general or special law, may embrace parts



Much speculation has been engagd in relative to conditions in this ecuntry after the war. Various prophcies have been made as to what prices of farm products would be and as to the financial and industrial status of the United States immedi- ! Of conditions when peace is made none of us know. But it would orm that with normal crops and normal transportation farmers have nothing to fear as to markets. There are good rinsons for believing that our products should be stimulated with higher prices for other commoditi s generally following a great war

Of one thing we should be sure, that unless some very positive re. scrictions are placed thousands of mmigrants will so k refuge here from taxation and devastation in Europa. That is likely to mean higher land values.

Now while banks have larger deposits and loans are more easily nego tiated than usual it would be a good time for those who can to buy homes. Judging the future by the past land values are not likely to decline. In fact, they are quite likely to advance Those who can buy a small farm that scems to be worth the price and can secure reasonable terms would seem to be justified in doing so. There are greater opportunities for comfort. able living and useful citizenship for home owners, Yet tenants can do much of value in the community. Their greatest handicap is the fact that they must move too often.

Even where one has a home, a sarden, an orchard and a f w acres to keep livestock he is in much better position to n at fertile land than where the home must be rinted. With such a place moving need not be done and school facilities lost. L'y stock can be kept, farming implements bought, household nacess'es accumulated and neighborhood attachments formed. These advantages an desirable when independent farming is done .- Farm and Ranch.


