Government agents who have been investigating the causes of the high prices for foodetuffs report that they have been unable to discover any evidence of conspiracies or agree. ments obnoxious to the anti-irust laws. This, too, seems to be the probable outcome of investigations that are being made in other parts of the country. The conclusion that the high prices of foodstuffo are due, chiefly, if not entirely, to natural causes gets some support from the statement given out by the Depart. ment of Agriculture the other day, showing the estimated value on the farm of the principal crops, mostly of foodstuffs. Notwithstanding that. with few and unimportant exceptions, the yields this year have been below the ten year average, the value of eee crops is placed at \$1,750,000,-900 above the value of the larger trops of last year.
