> Dealers and handlers of perishable products are expected to observe the laws, rules and regu- lations of the Bureau of Markets of the United States Depart ment of Agriculture and of the Texas State Department of Agpacking, and the instructions in packing, and loading in cars of all
bracing and lol perishable products, unless ex ceptions are authorized by th Federal Food Administrator.
Dealers and handlers of pe Dealers and handlers of per
ishable farm products at point ishable farm products at point
of origin are required to refuse ucts when loaded in cars containing superior and standardized products, as these commodities should not cumber ou transportation facilities, and hus deprive superior and stand tunity of arriving in the market in first-class condition.
All cars of perishable farm
products are to be loaded under the directions and instruction of the Western Weighing and In spection Bureau, and the inspec-
tors of the Bureau of Markets of the State Department of Ag or the State Department of Aghold the issuing of certificates setting forth grades of the prod ucts loaded, until he has satis fied himself that the car of pro duce certified to has been loade according to the directions and
instructions of the Western Weighing and Inspection Bureau; and when the inspector of
the Bureau of Markets of the State Department of Agriculture issues a certificate, setting north grade and standard of the com-
modities to be shipped, this cermodicate shall be accepted by the consignor and consignee as prima facie evidence of proper grade and quality at the time of
loading. oading.
All licensed dealers and han dlers of perishable farm prod
ucts of this State are expecter to co-operate with the Federal Food Administrator in the compliance and enforcement of the above rules and regulations.
It is not the purpose of the
above regulations to prevent the above regulations to prevent the shipment of cull fruits or vege
