

## HOW TO MEASURE MEAT RATION OF 2 POUNDS WEEKLY

Success of Equitable Meat Distribution Rests With Consumer; Plan Based on Patriotism and Voluntary Denial

It is estimated that \$50,000,-000 would be required if the nation were successfully placed on a ration system for the handling of wheat flour, sugar and meat, nor would this amount cover \ e er the system were inaugurated. "For this reason," announces the Federal Food Administration for Texas, "we look to the individual for co-operation in observing the ration suggested and to the distributor to see that the quantities suggested are dispensed as nearly in the degree suggested as possible.

The placing of all manufacturers using sugar on a rationing basis has been achieved at a great expense to the Food Administration. Sugar used by manufacturers may only be procured through the possession of a certificate issued by the state headquarters and the quantity is based upon a definite schedule of allotments.

While no instructions have been issued defining a program, it is thought by the Federal Food Administration that the time has come when public eating places and meat markets should begin to approximate their respective For County Treasurer, trade in numbers. Every meat dispenser should begin to collate a list of families making regular purchases at his place of business. Families of five would be encouraged to buy not more than ten pounds of meat a week; families of two not more than four pounds a week, and so forth. This is not ob-ligatory, but more and more as the war advances and military necessity demands increasing quantities of meat it would be to the advantage of every meat dispenser to know to a man the number of persons buying of his place of business.

If at the end of each day the meat dealer will divide the number of his customers with the pounds of meat bought, he will know the average purchase for the day in pounds per person; and if at the end of each week he will divide the total pounds sold by the total persons represented in the sales of the week, he will soon be in position to gauge whether or not he is meeting the federal requirements. Such information would be invaluable as the program is advanced to meet

military necessity.

All of this detail means additional work, but the present war is a test of the fitness of men in service at the front and in the business world to survive, and out of it the Food Administration believes that lack of business methods will disappear and men will come to know accurately the minute details and elements which make up their livelihood-facts which, because of too much prosperity and extrava-gance, have almost been obliterated from American life.

The demands for beef for our army and the allied army and their civil popelation for this summar are beyond our present surplus. It will therefore be a direct service to our armies and the allies if our people would in some degree substitute fresh pork, bacon, hams and sausage for beef products.

"We request all hotels and restaurants not to place on their menus or serve boiled beef more than two meals weekly; beefsteak more than one meal weekly, and roast beef more than one meal weekly.

"We ask householders not, under any circumstances, to buy more than one and one-quarter pounds of clear beef weekly; or one and one-half ounds, including the bone, per person in the household.

"The public will realize that the changing conditions of production from season to season, the changing situaseason to season, the changing situation in shipping and therefore of the markets available to the allies, and the increasing demands for our growing army, with the fluctuating supply of local beef in France, all make it impossible to determine policies for long periods in advance. We have recently asked for economy in all meat consumption. We wish now to emphasize further reduction of beef by the substitution of pork. It will be necessary for the merchant to continue keeping a record of his flour sales, the same as before the wheatless period became effective.

The resumption of the sale of flour does not release the hotel and restaurants who have v untarily agreed to go wheat! for some time to come.

House Joint Resolution No. 2. o amend Section 10, Article 1, of the Constitution of the state of Texas, providing for certain rights of accused persons in criminal prosecutions, and the manner in which the case may be prosecuted, and providing for the procuring of the testimony of the witnesses for both d fense and prosecution. Be it resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section (10) of Article (1) of the Constitution of the State of Texas be so amend ed that the same will read and tereafter be as follows:

Sec. 10, In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall have a speedy public trial by an impartial jury. He shall have the right to the accusation against him and right of being heard by himself r counsel, or both, shall be conn his favor, except that when he witness resides out of the state and the offense charged is a violation of any of the anti-trust 6 produce and have the evidence admitted by deposition, under such rules and laws as the Legslature may hereafter provide; inless on an indictment of a grand jury, except in cases in which the punishment is by fine or imprisonment, otherwise than in the penitentiary, in cases of imprachment and in cases arising n the army or navy, or in the militia, when in actual servce in time of war or public danger.

Sec. 2. The Governor of this tate is hereby directed o issue the necessary proclamation for the submission of this amendment to the qualified voters of this state at the next general election for state and county officers.


