The supreme court of United States has sustained the conviction of Eugene Debbs, the labor leader, for violation of the espionage act in a speech at Canton, Ohio. He was sentenced to ten years impris nment.

The Methodist centenary campaign date has been advanced to begin April 13, instead of April 27, as originally intended. It is proposed to raise thirty five million dollars for missions in the eight days of this campaign.

The war loan department announces that every worker connected with the Victory Liberty Loan Campaign will receive a medal made from captured German cannon. The medal will be the size of a fifty cent piece, will have a reproducti n of the Tressury Department on one side and a certification on the other that the owner has participated in the Loan. That cow is a delicately organized machine for the monufacture of milk and butter. She turns comparatively cheap raw material into comparatively valuable finished products. This is the process that makes for riches in nations. Scrub cows are about the same as crude machinery in their relations to industry They can not compete profitably with superior breeds or more medern equipments.
