RELATING TO CONFEDERATE PENSIONS AND INCREASING TAX RATES FOR PAYMENT OF

House Joint Resolution No. 35. Proposing an amendment to Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution of the state of Texas to provide that the legislature may grant pensions to Confederate soldiers, sailors and their widows, who have been eitizens of Texas prior to Jan. 1, 1910, providing that all soldiers, sailors and their widows eligible under the provisions hereof shall be entitled to be placed upon the rolls and par ticipate in the pension fund created hereunder; levying a tax of seven (\$.07) cents on the \$100.00 valuation of property in this state for the pay ment of such pension, providing that the legislature may reduce the rate of pension for such purpose, fixing a time for the election to be held on such amendment, and making appropriation to pay the expenses thereof:

Be it resolved by the legislature of the State of Texas:

Section 1. That Section 51 of Article 3 of the constitution of the state of Texas shall be amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 51. The legislature shall have money to any individual, association of individuals, municipals or other cor. porations whatsoever, provided how ever, the legislature may grant aid to indigent or disabled Confederate soldiers and sailors, who came to Texas prior to January 1, 1910, and to their widows in indigent circumstances ar who were married to such soldiers of sailors prior to January 1, 1910, an under special laws of the state Texas during the war between the states served in organizations for Indian raiders or Mexican and to indigent and disabled soldiers of the militia of the state of Texa who were in active service during the idows of such soldiers who are is adigent circumstances and who wer uary 1, 1910, provided that the word this section shall not apply to wome born since the year 1866, and all liers and sailors and widows of sol liers and sailors eligible under above conditions shall be entitled be placed upon the pension rolls participate in the distribution of the pension fund of this state under an xisting law or laws hereafter passe y the legislature, and also to grant id for the establishment and tenance of a home for said soldiers and sailors, their wives and widows under such regulations

PERMITTING GALVESTON COUN-TY AND CITY TO ISSUE BONDS FOR GRADE RAISING PURPOSES

Senate Joint Resolution No. 23. joint resolution proposing and sub mitting to the people of the state of Texas an amendment to Article sixteen of the constitution of the state of Texas by adding thereto a new section and authorizing the city of Galveston and county of Galves ton to issue bonds for protective works, irrespective of constitutional limitation, in the aggregate of five million dollars for both city and county, as may be by the city or county deemed necessary for the county deemed necessary for the raising of the grade, building sea-walls and breakwaters and doing any and all kinds of protective works in said city and county, and to levy and collect taxes to said bonds principal and interest, providing for a sinking fund and creating an emergency.

The State of Texas: Section 1.
