lough; \$5.00 cash by Trent State Bank. Mr. Dunn urged the pecan growers of this section to be very careful when threshing a crop not to knock the buds off the trees. These buds make the next years' erop of pecans.

Further Mr. Dunn stated that the marketing facilities of the pecan growers are in such a state that the northern buyers buy them from 10 to 15 cents per pound and sell them for from \$1 to \$1.70, thereby realizing several hundred per cent on their farsightedness at the growers' expense.

The purposes of the state association, as explained by Mr. Dunn, are to teach the growers the best method of caring for their trees, teach them to do their own budding, thereby rais ard of the nut grown, and supply them with adequate marketing facilities to handle the crop in the most remunerative method for the grower.

Several counties in West Texas have organized these associations and it is up to Mills county to fall in line or fall bebig thing in our county-bigger than Prettiest gallon of honey-\$1.00 by most people think-and could be made a great deal bigger.

THE BOLL WEEVIL BUG-A-BOO.

Going down the street the other day we met a number of prominent farmers from different sections of the county and asked them about the cotton situation in Mills county. We were lucky enough to happen to get a pretty good representative of the different sections and the different temperaments of the county. We received answers to our questions something like this: "I haven't a square of cotton in my field and the boll weevils are setting four on every stalk-waiting."

"They are getting it all-the county is ruined.'

But I met a pare D, dyed-in-the-wool optimist and Democrat who answered my question:

"There are no boll weevils in my section and cotton is fine, plenty of rain-'n everything.

The fact is that the boll weevil is hurting only a few isolated sections, in some places doing considerable damage, but limiting the quantity of the croy at the most. Mills county will raise bumper cotton crop this year, and price of cotton will be good.
