





Regulation II.-It is hereby ordered that on and after March 1, 1922, no honey bees, used honey combs, used bee hives, used or second hand apiary fixtures or appliances shall be moved or shipped from one county to another unless they are accompanied by a health certificate or special permit given by the state entomolo-

Regulation III.-It is hereby ordered that on and after March 1, 1922, all apiaries or bee yards wherein American Foulbrood is known to exist are hereby declar-ed to be under quarantine. The removal of any and all bees, queen bees, colonies, nuclei, combs and apiary appliances or fixtures is prohibited, except unknown to exist are hereby declarder such cases as the state entomologist, his assistants of inspectors may permit or approve. Such quarantine shall exist until such time as the state entomologist. his assistants or inspectors shall determine and declare such apiary to be apparently free from American Foulbrood.

The keeping of bees in box hives, gums, logs, barrels, or other domiciles not equipped with movabl frames permitting ready examination of all combs is unlawful. Bees kept in any form of hive except one containing movable frames permitting ready examination are subject to treatment or destruction by the state entemologist, his assistants or inspectors, at the owner's expense as provided by Section 16, chapter 51, General Laws of Texas.
