Last Saturday a forged bill of sale to the car was found on a man at Cleburne. This bill of sale was back traced to the man who had the car.



A JOINT RESOLUTION

S. J. R. No. 33. Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas removing from 'the Constitution all limitations as to the amount of compensation of officers, the compensation and expenses of said officers to be as provided by law, and fixing the compensation of the Governor, and providing that said amendment shall be effective on and after January 1 1929, and not sooner.

Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas:

SECTION 1. That Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by inserting therein a new section to be numbered Section 30a which shall read as follows:

Section 30a. All provisions of the present Constitution of Texas fixing or limiting the amount of salary or compensation of officers and members of Legislature
