Some of his disciples, noticing that the discpiles of Jesus were not fasting, came to him aout it. They could not understand why it was that he who claimed to be a new teacher come God to teach the will of God more, perfectly should niot rethe fasts. Jesus answered in effect that we do not expect the "sons of the Bridechamber" (i. e., the special friends of the bridegroom) to fast while the bridegroom was with them. it While the Master was with them it was a time for rejoicing fasting - a sign of sorrowwould come when he went away. While Jesus did not eat the barley himself, it was easy for the Pharisees, who in the crowd, to hold him responsible for his deciples conduct, and their eyes flashed with indigna. tion against him as they deman ded, "Why do they on the Sabbath day that which is not law. fulq" Jesus aecepted the responsibility. <br> It was easy to see $\sin$ in the conduit of those they despised; he would call attention to a sim ilar case in which one of their Jew ever thought that. (The Authorized Version of Luke says, "on another sabbath''; but the passage may be translated simply, "on a Sabbath.") In the congregation there was a man whose hand had been witkered by paralysis. The Pharisees were there also. Mathew tells us that they ask Jesus, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath days ?', that they might accuse him. He saw the trap, saw their hippocracy, and he buined with indignation. Commanding the man with the wihered hand to stand up, he said, "It is lawful to do well on the Sabbath day"; and suiting his actions to his words (he could always do that!) he restored the withered hand, though he knew the act would eventually cost him his life. <br> This so inceased the Phariseesthat they imediately went and held a consultation to devise plans for putting him to death. <br> Mrs. A.
