1st. For General Revenue pur oses, to be known as the Genne Hundred Dollars valuaion, which is hereby set aside for general uses and purposes. 2nd. To provide interest and for creating a sinking fund for outstanding water works bonds Twenty-five cents on the one

Hundred Dollars valuation. 3rd. For a road, street and bridge fund, to be known as the Street Fund, Twenty-five Cents on the Hundred Dollars valuation.






