**CHEVROLET EXECUTIVE SEES BRIGHT FUTURE**

W. S. Knudsen, president and general manager of Chevrolet Motor Company, reputed one of the most conservative executives in the industry, predicted at Detroit last week that Chevrolet production for the coming year would call for an output which would equal at least 1,250,000 cars and trucks. Fifteen mammoth factories throughout the country, according to Knudsen, are now working at top speed building the new six. Cars are being distributed to the dealer organization as fast as they come off the line, so that as many as possible will be on display and ready for delivery December 29.

Tens of thousands have already placed orders can feel assured of early deliveries, Mr. Knudsen said, when they bear in mind that 90 days after the introduction of the 1928 car more than a quarter million of them were on the highways in owner service. He further recalled that by June 1 of the present year, five months after the January announcement, a half million cars were in use. And before October 1 the company established a record of building and delivering 1,000,000 cars which Mr. Knudsen referred to as the greatest single achievement in the history of the automobile industry.

Mr. Knudsen's optimism over the coming year, he explained, has its basis in continued prosperity and in what he interprets as a well defined preference on the part of the public for the six cylinder car. "The year just coming to a close found Chevrolet preparing itself for the advent of the new six. Numerous expansions were brought to completion, adding to our facilities several hundred thousand feet

of floor space. The natural result of all this has been an increased productive capacity. "With these expanded and improved facilities, and our new and improved product which is to sell at virtually the same price as our four cylinder cars, we feel assured of marching toward new records this year, at the same time striving our utmost to maintain in full the public's confidence in the Chevrolet Motor Company," Mr. Knudsen concluded.

### RURAL SCHOOL CLASSIFICATION

Editor Eagle:

As our Honorable County School Board has just completed the classification of each school in the county, I wish to call the attention of your many readers some things about this that seems to me to be unfair; for instance the present classifications would prohibit any school with fewer than four teachers from teaching higher than two grades above the seventh grade. Now I do not believe this to be fair to all alike. I believe in justice to the rural children that all schools in the county that can maintain three teachers or more, should be classified as second class high schools and should have the privilege of teaching to and including the tenth grade work. Because a general diffusion of knowledge being essential to the preservation of the liberties and rights of the people. It is not right to deprive children of their privilege of their home school and say when they have finished the ninth grade they must go to urban schools to get the tenth grade work or go home and get the grub-hoe.

Now under the present classification there is no depravity to rural boy or girl if you have the price. The urban schools are standing with outstretched arms of love to welcome them in, but without the price, then what? I have in mind just now a little girl in my community who has worked hard at her books and has great aims for an education. She finished the ninth grade last year and is now ready for the tenth grade work, and whose dear old father has labored untiringly to help build his girl a school, but whose health has failed him and now he has spent almost all his worldly goods trying to regain it, and cannot possibly send his girl away from home to school. Now under the present classification of our rural schools as made by our Honorable County Board, this girl must retire from school, while if she was permitted to go forward in her rural school this year, by

the next school session probably conditions might change, and she could take the seventh grade elsewhere and graduate with honors and retain her high aims and bright future. Now I am not fighting the town school I am proud of them. The town needs good schools and the rural districts needs good schools also. We need the town and they need us. So therefore come let us reason together.

I have noted a number of cases where children taken to towns for schooling, it is very difficult to get them interested in rural activities any more. But one says: Your child can advance faster in the city schools than in the rural schools. Probably so, but it's human nature when we cannot have the best to want second best. So it's just in this case that the rural schools have it.

Conditions are continually dropping here and there on this and that home that will totally deprive many rural children from further education than their rural school offers. So I say to the fathers and mothers who have rural interests, let's begin to think and consider the things that concern our rural schools. There is something wrong somewhere—let's find it.

Then with consolidated forces let's turn the right side up.

There are just three public enterprises to rural life: first the school, the church, and the public roads. When your school interest is gone, your church will soon follow and then the road commission will see that

we have no self interest and will cease to build and maintain our public roads. Now what I have had to say is out of due respect to all concerned in this matter and for the interest of the boys and girls who decorate the hoe handle and cotton sack.

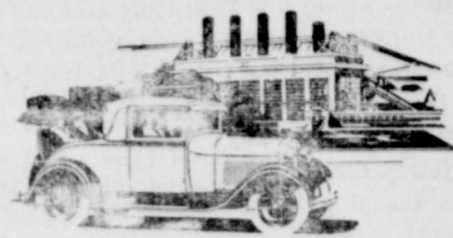

## The utilities of a city are combined in your motor car

The storage battery should be given water and the connections kept clean. The generator charging rate should be changed as indicated. Spark plugs should be cleaned at regular intervals. Distributor points should also be kept clean and the distributor cam given a light film of vaseline every 2000 miles.

These are just little things, but they mean a great deal to your car. You can have them looked after at very small cost by the Ford dealer when you take the car in for oiling and greasing.
