



This method is the one employed by all counties laving superintendents and could not raise the taxes in the county. The Rural Aid schools would not be effected financially, as the support of a counyt superintendent is a legitimate charge against the State Aid Fund, and is allowed in all counties. The bill provided further for the appointment of the Superintenden"By the County Board of Editeration. This provision was in Preordance with the amendment passed by a mjority of the people of Texas in the July election of 1928. 




