"The government," says U. S. News \& World Recountry. In the single year to end next June 30, the Treasury will spend an estimated $\$ 46,000,000,000$ in cold cash. This means that $\$ 1$ out of every $\$ 6$ spent in The magazine then goes into considerable detail as to how all this money is to be divided.
