Last Tuesday the representative of the Fire Insurance Commission spent the day going over the entire key-rate fire insurance set-up in Goldthwaite. It had taken a long time to get such a representative here because the Fire Insurance Commission does not have enough field men. But once he arrived the following conclusions were
