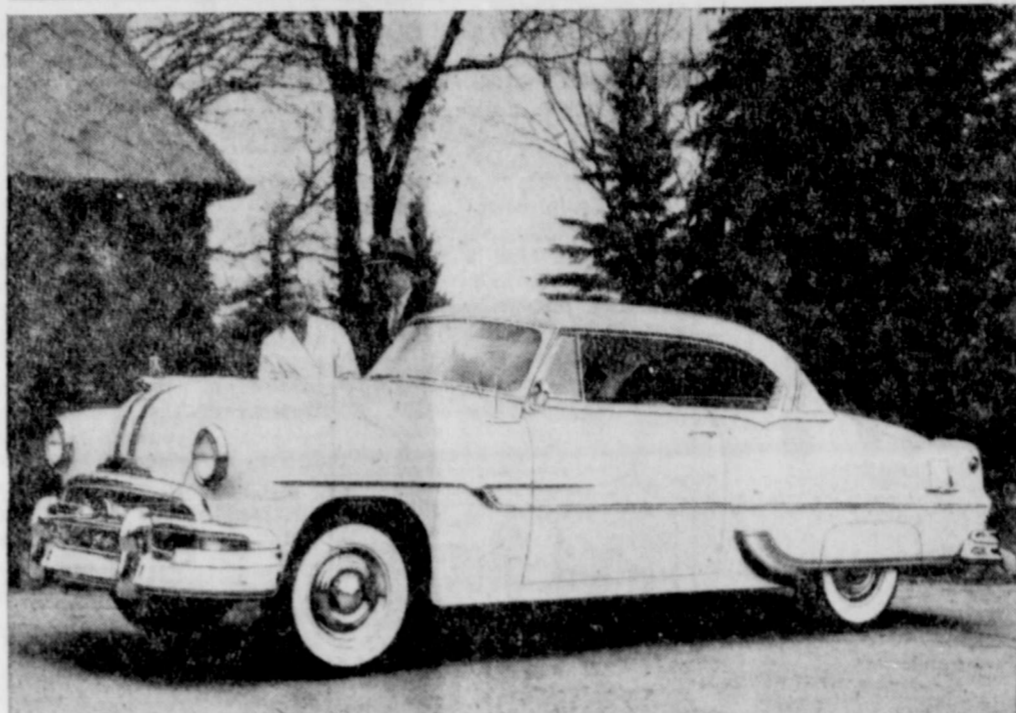
### 1953 Pontiac On Display Saturday

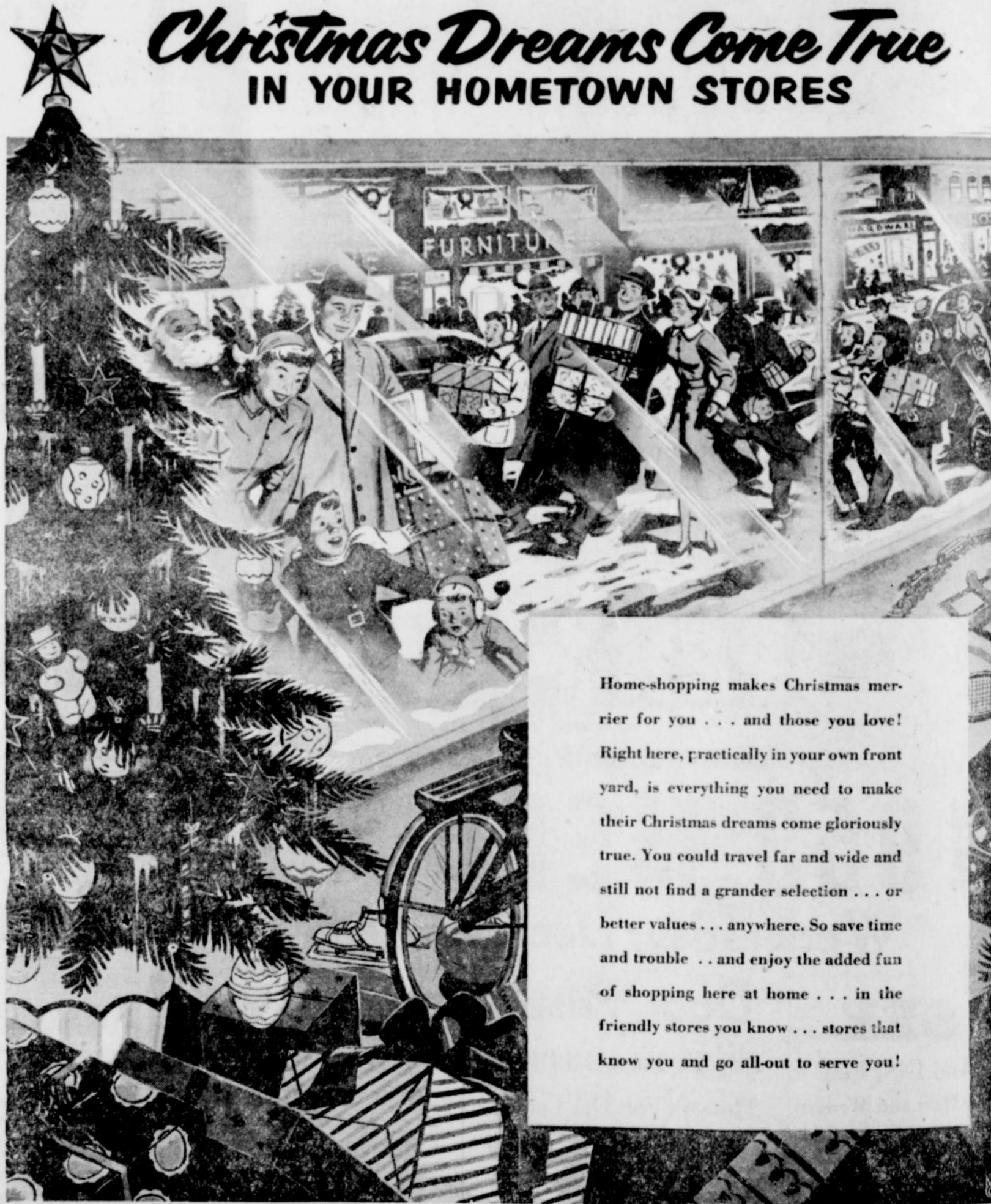

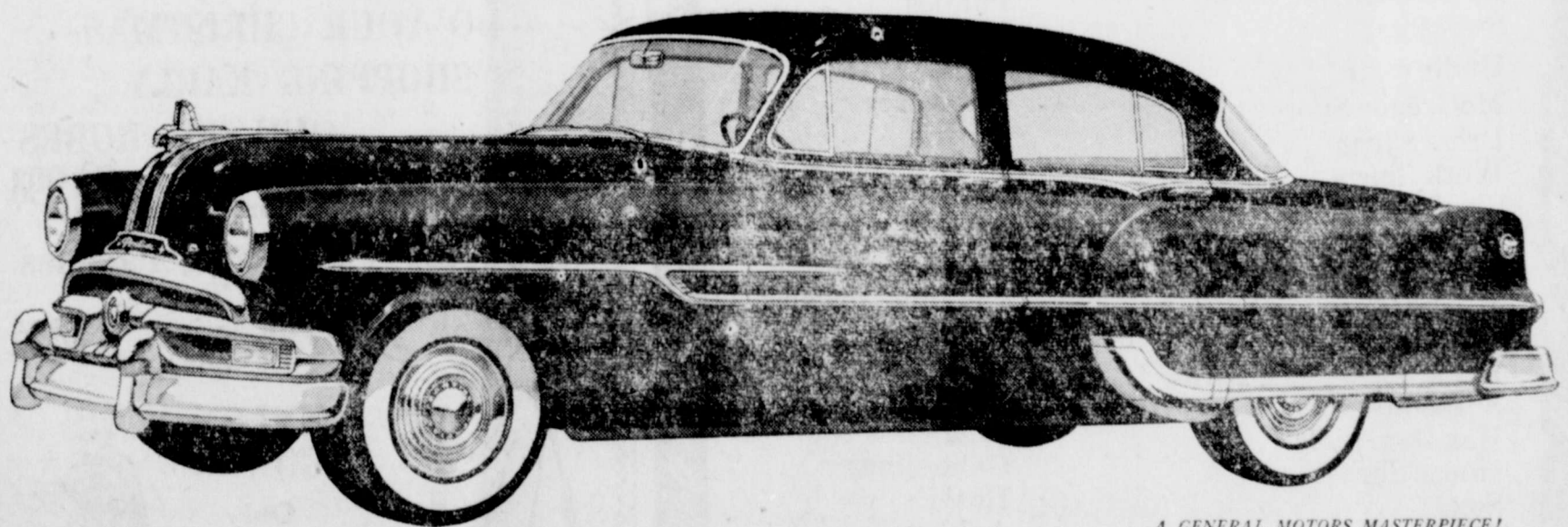
