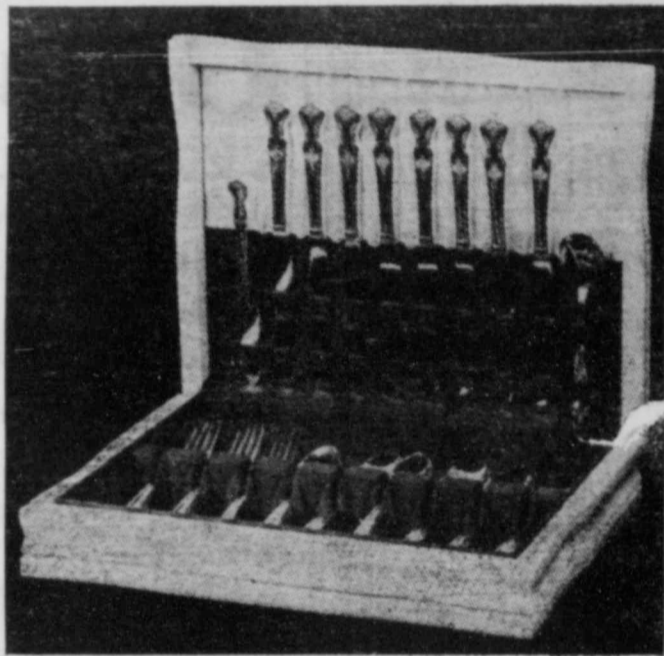

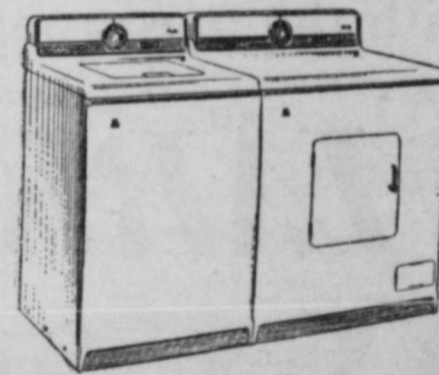

rind, and sinkers. The line should be of strong, non-twist cotton, silk, or nylon, for the twirling motion that trolling gives to lures quickly snarls ordinary line.

Your sporting-goods dealer can tell you just what kind and weight-test of line to use in your particular case.

Lures can be spoons, wigglers, or bucktailed hardware of any sort that attracts attention. Be sure, though, that your lure is weedless, and that your line and leader are strong, for you are bound to hang up now and then on logs or trash, especially when your lure runs deep.

Should you own no rod and reel, then buy a cheap set. Any casting outfit can be used in trolling. A stiff rod is in this case preferred.

As for the most effective trolling bait — there is none. Lures depend on the particular time and location. Try each of the ones mentioned above. If none of them work, then hook on an extra bucktail, or bacon rind. Red flannel is often effective when attached to a Dixie

Spoon.

Spoons, however, are the all-around trolling favorite, the secret of their success seeming to be their twinkling brightness as they slide through the water.

Small plugs are sometimes used, both surface and deep-running. Blacks are more likely to take these.

If you are after whites, stick to some sort of rigged-up spoon. Most trollers carry a good supply of the lures mentioned, to be ready for any eventuality.

And, oh yes! Be sure you have a long, strong stringer on hand. You will probably need it.

When black bass strike at trolling lures you will find it usually is when the bait passes weed beds, logs, etc.

Whites are different. They run in schools, whereas blacks are found singly, or in small groups.

Trolling, whether for whites of blacks, takes a degree of know-how and skill. Don't just get in your boat, fling your line in the water and zip up and down the lake, with your lure bouncing around on the surface far behind like a skipping pebble.

Instead, first determine which of the two fish you aim to catch. Then study the shore line, snap the best bait for the fish you have chosen, and work the weed beds, now and then dragging your bait near land promontories and coves.

Cut the motor down to one or two miles an hour and play your line. Let it drop a good distance back, then bring it to within ten or fifteen feet of the boat.

Motor noise doesn't seem to frighten bass. Often they follow the whirling propeller, and large blacks have been known

to attack an outboard's spinning blades, apparently in anger. Most trollers report their biggest catches when their lures are as close as fifteen feet behind the boat.

If you have poor success near the surface, try letting your spoon, or plug, sink deeper. Admittedly, this increases the danger of your lure snagging on logs, rocks, or trash, but it may also bring surprising results, not only in the size and number of fish caught, but in the variety.

Channel catfish of two or three pounds have been hooked with spoons and small, deep-running lures. Big channel cat put up a terrifically exciting battle, and will give you plenty to talk about later.

Once you catch a channel cat, make a half-dozen passes over the same area. Usually cat run in loose schools of from several to a dozen or more, and you may catch others near the same spot.

White bass, as mentioned previously, run in schools, but white bass are taken differently from catfish.

Usually the troller can see the white bass school working on the surface. So look for agitated water. This water agitation is caused by shad trying to escape the feeding whites. Often, on large lakes, you can

locate feeding schools of whites by watching for flocks of sea-gulls soaring down over the water and diving for shad. Actually the gulls are feeding on shad the whites have crippled.

When you spot such a school, run your boat back and forth, dragging your spoon again and again through the school. If the fish are really striking you will find you have hit a bonanza. Sometimes a lucky troller will get dozens of strikes in as many minutes in a hundred foot area, and fill his stringer then and there with two and three pound whites.

Many fishermen contend that trolling is the most rewarding method of taking fish. A man is more likely to get his limit, and experience faster action by trolling.

So take a tip from the deep sea fishing boys, who use this method often, and try trolling the next time you have an urge to wet a line. It's great!

## Mills County Bond Sales For Month Of October

During the month of October the citizens of Mills County purchased \$18,372 in Series E and H Savings Bonds.

This announcement was made recently by W. P. Duren, Chairman of Mills County's Savings Bonds Committee.

"Sales for the first ten months of this year totaled \$207,172," Chairman Duren reported. "We have now achieved 97.3% of our 1958 goal of \$213,000."

Sales in Texas during the first ten months of 1958 were \$146,136,258 which represents 83.5% of the 1958 goal of \$175,000,000.

"Under a recent change in Treasury regulations, individuals who hold F and G Bonds that mature after September 1, 1958 may invest the proceeds from the maturing bonds in E and H Bonds without regard to annual purchase limits," Duren announced. "This information should be of interest to hundreds of people in this area who hold maturing F and G Bonds," he concluded.

## FHA Home Financing Available To Low And Medium Income Families

The Voluntary Home Mortgage Credit Program has demonstrated its ability to assist the low and medium income families in small towns to obtain FHA financing.

The Program statistics reveal that a very high per cent of the loans placed were for persons in the \$3500 to \$5000 per year income group. The majority of loans were for purchase of homes in the \$7000 to \$9000 price range.

These figures were furnished by C. J. Hermann, Executive Secretary of VHMCP, Region IV, which comprises the states of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas. The Regional Office is located at 1114 Commerce Street, Dallas 2, Texas.

"At this time," Hermann stated, "due to the unrealistic

VA interest rate, we have no lenders participating in the Program making GI loans." Hermann commented, however, that there were many lending institutions participating in the Program making FHA loans.

"I'm afraid people in the small towns are not taking advantage of the splendid mortgage plan offered by FHA," Hermann added. "It is possible and even probable that many do not understand that FHA mortgage loans can be obtained in the smaller towns provided they meet FHA minimum standards."

VHMCP is a Program designed to assist individuals in small towns (under 25,000) to obtain FHA insured loans if there is no local source for such funds. The Program does not make loans, but only serves as a clearing house to bring together

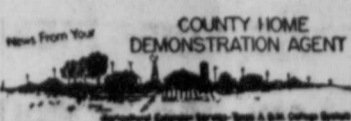

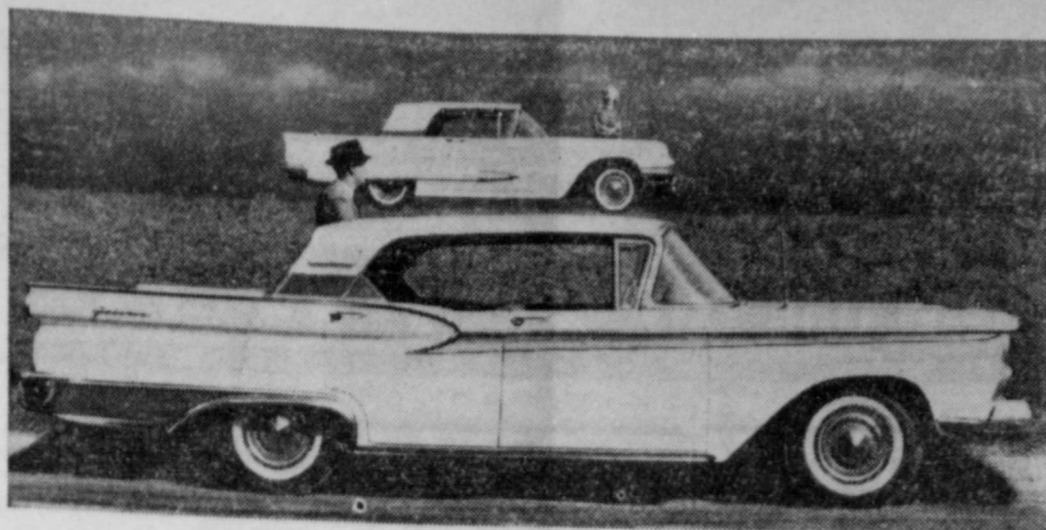

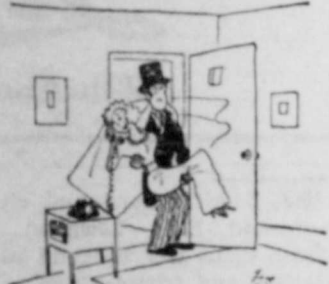

## Texas Sheep And Goat Raisers Hold Annual Meeting In Dallas

The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association will hold its 43rd annual meeting in Dallas beginning Monday, December 8.

Advance registrations indicate more than 350 will attend the three-day meeting at Hotel Adolphus, T. A. Kincaid, Ozona, the state president, said.

Delegates will hear leading national authorities discuss physical measurements of wool

and their relationship to wool value, range management, wool and mohair utilization and other recent developments in the industry.

Awards will be presented to state winners of the sheep and goat and wool and mohair contests.

All wool growers, regardless of membership, are invited to attend the convention sessions.

The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association was organized in 1915 in Del Rio primarily to fight livestock theft.

However, it soon instigated research into methods of controlling diseases of sheep and goats.

The association brought about

the founding of the Ranch Experiment Station near Sonora, which has proven invaluable to the industry.

It also was instrumental in bringing about establishment of the Forestry and Range Management School at Texas A&M College and the wool scouring plant in the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station.

Texas is still the nation's top wool producing state, although the number of animals is far down because of the recent drought.

The Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association has its headquarters in San Angelo.

Officers in addition to Kincaid include Lance Sears, Sweetwater, first vice president; L. M. Stephens, Lometa, second vice president, and Ernest Williams, San Angelo, executive secretary.

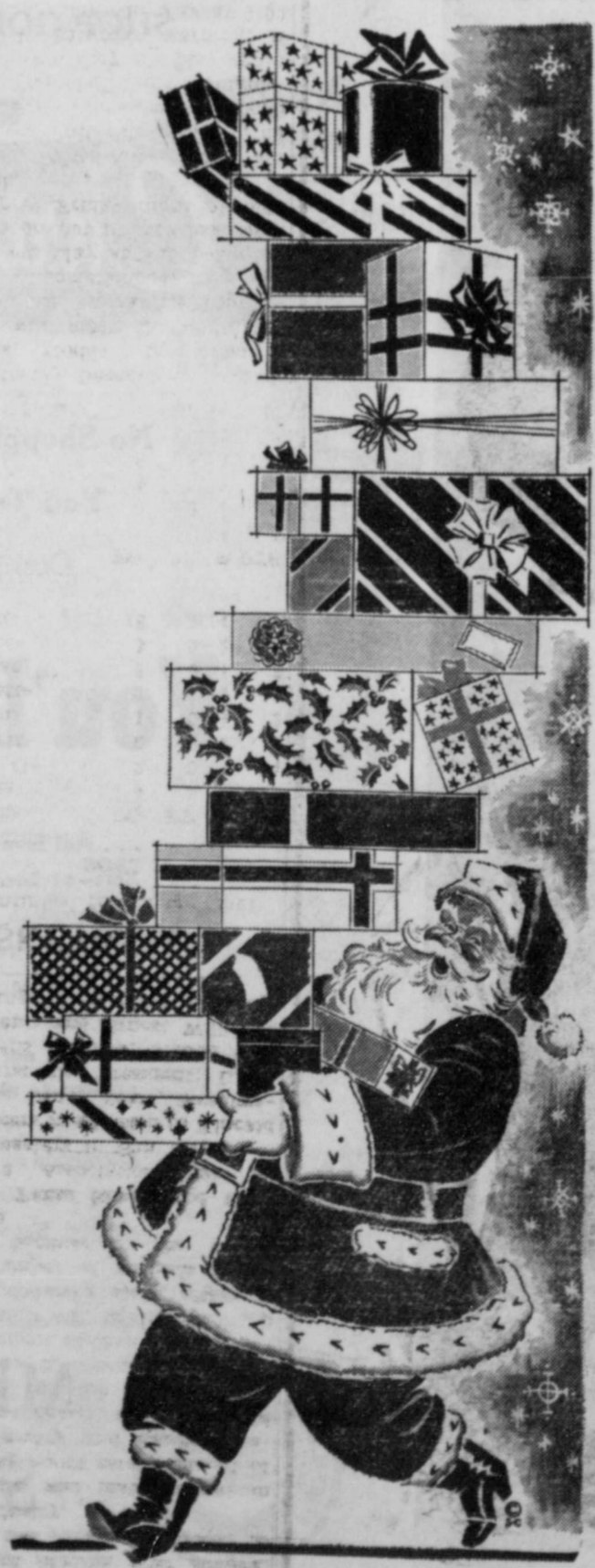
