John M. Arthur, Resident Engineer at Goldthwaite will be in charge of the project while it is under construction.

The project will provide a new intersection for the two highways with an additional traffic lane. The big hill on the east side of present highway will be cut down and the existing highway grade will be lowered for a distance of about 2,500 feet. Improvements will cut out the landscaped triangle as it appears today.



FROM THE MAIL BAG-Flossie (Mrs. W. E.) Fairman writes a miscellaneous shower which from Marlin, Texas:


"The Mulberry Tree you mentioned recently in your Column was not so large when I went there to live in January 1919.
