

'For Unto You This Day Is Born a Saviour . . .'



The 1,075 items involved in the two programs, covering a total of 224 counties, will all be done during the next calendar year. A total of 2,799 miles of U. S. and State Highways and 3,694 miles of Farm-to-Market Roads are included in the work list. 

Mr. Shelton learned much in his blacksmith shop as he saw the needs of his neighbors in a radius of 15 miles and he worked to become skilled in every phase of the work of blacksmithing in order to give the best service possible to his customers. In 1920 he installed a second forge and taught his son Ollie (O. P.) to operate it. O. P. Shelton is now owner of Shelton Bros. Motor Company in Gold-

The Shelton Blacksmith Shop became famous for the excellent work done there in welding, sharpening of tools, and repair of buggies and wagons. Often there were as many as a half dozen wagons around the shop waiting for repairs.

By hard work Mr. Shelton developed himself into an expert wheelwright, developing an excellent method for shrinking wagon tires as it was no kid's job to shrink a steel wagon tire. When the low wheel wagons came into use he cut wheels down on over 100 high wheel wagons in the county.

Horseshoeing was his joy! It made no difference how wild they kicked; it was very seldom that a horse left his shop without wearing shoes. He shod horses for \$1.00 including shoes and nails.

He helped his neighbors grub and put their land in cultivation He said one time. "I am like an old horse; I have to keep moving to keep from fallin'."
