

# School Board Calls \$80,000 Bond Election

The Board of Education Goldthwaite Independent School District has called an election for Saturday, May 27, to approve \$80,000 bond issue for building improvements. Proposed improvements would include converting the old three-story high school building into agriculture and band building, dressing rooms that would meet state standards for the new and new vestibule at front

of the gym. Architects and engineers had previously informed school officials that the old high school building was of sound structure to be converted. It will be redone with new and modernistic appearance. Representatives of the firm met with the school board and presented drawings of proposed improvements. Converting the three story, steel and concrete

structure into agriculture and band building is estimated at \$27,156; dressing rooms of the gymnasium estimated at \$29,964 and the front vestibule estimate is \$13,527. These estimates come to \$70,647 on the buildings. Fees are estimated at \$5,508 and equipment for the shop and gym would bring the total amount of money needed to \$80,000. School officials and members

of the board of education have been working on plans for some time to make improvements that have been needed to meet state recommendations and requirements. After studying the matter for the past several months and having received recommendations from architects and engineers it was decided to call the election and proceed with the program.

The proposed bond issue would cost taxpayers an estimated fifteen cents increase in tax rate, over a 20 year period, according to school board officials. The board also voted to go the route of Senate Bill No. 116 for the future welfare of the district and more attractive bonding proposition. This is to be a second proposal on the ballot. In the election on Saturday,

May 27, taxpayers of the district will be voting on two propositions. One, is to approve the \$80,000 bond issue, and two, is to give the school board the authority to increase the tax over and above the maintenance levy to pay for bonded indebtedness with the same reductions on the tax rolls at the present time.

A public meeting has been scheduled by the school board for next Tuesday night, May 23, at 8, in the high school auditorium. All resident taxpayers are invited to attend this meeting when the bond issue will be discussed. Officials will welcome everyone and will try to explain the program and answer questions that patrons may have.

The meeting will be held at 8 p. m. at the Goldthwaite High School, May 22.

Elgin Smith, Work Unit Conserver, SCS, will tell about the Responsibilities of the USDA County Emergency Planning Committee and Lee Tabor, office manager of the Mills County ASC office, will evaluate the program. Each Mills County resident is invited to attend this meeting.

If a nuclear attack were to be made upon the United States, all segments of our population and of our economic structure would be affected.

Thus, agriculture would share the Nation's total difficulty and still be faced with special problems. The United States Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with other agencies of

Federal and State governments, is responsible for helping to develop means by which farm people could cope with these special problems for their own protection and to maintain farm production in times of emergency.

**WRINKLE-FREE FINISHES**  
As the temperature rises, so does the homemaker's weekly pile of laundry. But — thanks to new fabrics and new finishes on today's market—the weekly wash-load in most homes isn't what it used to be. Wrinkle - resistant finishes can help make summer clothes easier to care for in several ways. Treated cottons, linens, rayons, and nylons don't need laundering so often because they shed soil as well as wrinkles. When they do require laundering, they usually are easier to iron.  
Some fabrics respond to wrinkle - resistance treatment better than others do. Lightweight cottons, such as voile and gingham, usually take the treatment very well. However, some treated rayons will show most wrinkles, and good-quality linens may wrinkle to some extent after treatment although they won't get a rumpled look.  
As you shop, you can test the effectiveness of a finish by crushing the material in your hand to see how well it resists wrinkles and sheds creases. Because these finishes vary in durability, researchers suggest that you look for a label stating that the finish is permanent.

## SCHOOL BOARD MINUTES

### REGULAR MEETING OF GOLDTHWAITE I. S. D. BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY 8, 1961

The Board of Education of Goldthwaite I. S. D. met in regular session May 8, 1961. Charles Conradt, president, called the meeting to order with O. P. Jones being asked to act as secretary for the meeting and L. R. Rudd, L. B. Burnham, Walton Daniel and Elmo Watson present. Secy. J. D. Jones was out of town. Supt. Jones, Gordon T. Charlton and Paul Coates of Allen, Texas and Legge were present. Minutes of the meeting of May 4, 1961 were approved without changes. Resolutions were studied and ordered as presented upon motion of Daniel, a second by Burnham and a unanimous vote. Consideration of the contract with Al Coates and Legge as architects and engineers on our pro-

posed building improvement program was introduced. After proper consideration and discussion on every phase of the contract, it was moved by Burnham, seconded by Daniel and voted unanimously to accept and approve the contract as examined by E. B. Gilliam. (Copy of Contract filed in school office.)

Paul Coates presented floor plan drawings of the proposed improvements showing an estimate on the Old High School converting it into a shop-band building on modernistic appearance at a cost of \$27,156.00; dressing rooms of the gymnasium at a cost of \$29,964.00 (Estimate) and the cost of the front vestibule was estimated at \$13,527.00 thus totaling \$70,647 on buildings and \$5,508.00 on fees and equipment for shop and gym to bring total amount of money needed to \$80,000.00. After proper discussion and consideration, Daniel moved, Shelton seconded and the vote on the motion was unanimous that the program be approved in its entirety and the information program be set into motion.

Mr. Gordon Charlton had previously met with the board relative to handling the bond issue, doing all the work in connection with setting up of Bond election, issuance of bonds, sale of bonds to highest bidder, etc. Mr. Charlton was representing The Columbian Securities. It was moved by Burnham, seconded by Daniel and voted unanimously to employ Columbian Securities for the fiscal work on standard Texas Contract basis which will be drawn, examined and approved upon its completion.

Motion was made by Daniel, seconded by Watson and voted unanimously to go on the Route of Senate Bill No. 116 in order for future welfare of the district and more attractive bonding proposition—this to be a second issue in the forthcoming election, such election to be called as soon as practical and on May 27, 1961 if practical. Motion was made by Burnham, seconded by Watson and voted unanimously to name Love Gatlin as election judge, Mamie Palmer and Teauline Raley as election clerks, all at \$10.00 each per day. It was unanimously approved that we adjourn to reconvene without further notice on May 11, 1961 at 8:00 P. M. to work off the other propositions of our agenda as set up for the regular meeting of May 8 and also to accept the petition if such is presented and order the election.

CALLED MEETING OR CONTINUED MEETING OF THE GOLDTHWAITE I. S. D. BOARD—The Board of Education was reconvened on May 11, 1961 with Charles Conradt acting as president, O. P. Shelton, Secretary, Walton Daniel, L. B. Burnham, L. R. Rudd and Elmo Watson in attendance. J. D. Harper was in a meeting of The Mills County Cancer Association and was not in attendance. This was a continuation of the meeting of May 8, 1961 and took up the unfinished agenda of that date.

There came on to be considered a petition of Jesse Moreland and others, who are qualified tax paying-rendering voters of The Goldthwaite I. S. D. asking that an election be called for the purpose set forth (a copy is filed) in the petition calling for a bond of \$80,000.00.

to bear interest not exceeding 5% per annum. After careful consideration, due discussion and meditation, Watson moved, Shelton seconded and the vote stood unanimous for calling the election as petitioned.

After due discussion of all angles such as rate of interest, amount of bonds, welfare of the pupils of the school district it was moved by Burnham, seconded by Daniel and carried unanimously that the election be called for May 27, 1961 in accordance with laws of Texas governing such elections — the ballot to contain the two propositions.

Supt. Jones presented the needs for revision of Handbooks for Trustees and Teacher-Pupils so that all may know what the policies and standards are at all time and so that Guidance may be made easier for students. It was moved by Shelton, seconded by Burnham and voted unanimously that the Handbooks be printed and put into use.

Motion was made by Daniel and seconded by Watson that five of our school lunch room workers be employed for 1961-62 school at a like salary and that the sixth be employed tentatively as used if needed. The motion prevailed. The five will include Mrs. Welch, Mrs. Loreta Long, Mrs. Lola Huffman, Mrs. Opal Henkes and Mrs. Mildred Crumley. Mrs. Ruth Brown is named as the tentative employee. Mrs. Mattie Murphy is recommended as the extra if a seventh is used and Mrs. Lillian Welch is to be Supervisor.

Graduation requirements and promotions were discussed and considered. It was moved, seconded and voted unanimously to continue the standards and policies as set up under the administrators and teachers; and that the new standards of 20 units required for graduation be set up in the new handbook.

Motion was made by Daniel and seconded by Rudd and voted unanimously to raise each of the six bus driver salaries by \$10.00 per month for 1961-1962 school term; night trips be raised to \$3.00 and day trips to \$8.00 per trip and each elected driver be required to make trips when called upon by designated authority.

Motion was made, seconded and voted unanimously to re-hire Robert Terry as Janitor at \$150.00 per month from July 1, 1961 to June 30, 1962.

Motion was made by Shelton, seconded by Burnham—Luther Jernigan, P. R. Reid and H. J. McKenzie be named as Board of Equalization at the same salary of \$20.00 per day for time worked. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Rudd, seconded by Watson that we recommend to the County Board that we participate in The Cooperative Program for next year. The motion carried unanimously.
