Cantwell, national director of Red Cross Safety Services, said. To prevent them and other waterside accidents, he advocated these precautions:

9. Dry off after swimming. Cover up if it's chilly

10. In ocean and river swimming watch for riptides and currents. Lifeguards will tell you how to recognize these conditions and how to save yourself if you are caught.
